



No. P-1 (13).—It is hereby notified for general information that the following comments by the Chief Inspector of Explosives in Pakistan shall be added to rules 102 and 103 of the Petroleum Rules, 1937. The existing para. of *Comments by the Chief Inspector of Explosives* below Rule 102 shall be numbered as sub-para. (1) and the following added as sub-para. (2) :—

2. The constructional details for lightning protective system for metallic and ferro-cement petroleum tanks should conform with the following instructions :

(i) *Air Termination*.—Copper rod-hard or medium hard drawn $\frac{1}{2}$ " in diameter, projecting at least one foot above the object on which it is fixed. It should be flattened at the lower end, soldered and double riveted with the down conductor.

(ii) *Down Conductor*.—For tanks having base area of 1,000 sq. ft. and/or a height not exceeding 60 ft.—copper strip soft annealed $\frac{3}{4}$ " x 1/8". For all other structures—copper strip, soft annealed 1" x 1/8".

The steel reinforcement of ferro-cement tanks metallic pipes of tanks should not be bonded with the down conductor. The down conductor should follow the most direct path possible between the air termination and the earth termination. There should be no up-turn in any down conductor and the radius of any bend should be as great as possible. If a down conductor is required to pass through a cement concrete bed of a tank it should pass through an opening filled with loose earth.

(iii) *Earth terminations*.—Copper plate 2' x 2' x 3/16". The down conductor should be soldered to the earth plate and twice riveted or bolted with copper bolts. The plate should be buried 3' below sub-soil water in two layers of 6" thick coke at least 6 yards away from the object. If the sub-soil water emanates from a spring 50 lbs. of rock salt solution should be put into the bed of the earth plate.

(iv) *General*.—A lightning protective system should have as few joints in it as possible. Where these are necessary they should be soldered and at least double riveted or bolted with copper bolts to ensure mechanical as

well as electrical soundness. Joints and bonds other than at testing points should be protected by an inert tenacious material. Down conductors should be sited on an outside wall and never on the inner face.

Below Rule 103 the existing comments by the Chief Inspector of Explosives shall be replaced by the following :—

"COMMENTS BY THE CHIEF INSPECTOR OF EXPLOSIVES"

The Inspection under this Rule should be carried out in the following manner :—

- (1) Examine visually all joints and connections above ground to discover if any of these are loose or disconnected.
- (2) While testing an individual earth connection other connections fitted on the object should be disconnected. The electrical resistance to earth should be tested and measured either by means of a direct reading instrument or by the procedure laid down in the "Code of Instructions for guidance of Public Works Officers in the erection and testing of lightning conductors". The "British Standard Code Practise C. P. 326.101 (1948)" may be consulted for further details.
- (3) Earth resistance should not ordinarily exceed 1/Ohm though 10 Ohms is the permissible limit.

CAUTION

The use of any testing instrument capable of producing a spark, which is not shielded as to be incapable of igniting inflammable vapour, is prohibited under Rule 91.



B.—In exercise of the powers conferred on him by sub-section (1) of section 31 of the Baluchistan Opium Smoking Regulations, 1950 (Regulation No. IV of 1950), the Chief Commissioner is pleased to make the following rules prescribing the terms and conditions on which persons who were addicted to the smoking of opium on the 29th September 1950 (the date on which the regulation came into force) may be exempted from the operation of sub-section 1 of section 3 of the Regulation.

1. These rules may be called the "Baluchistan Opium-Smoking Exemption Rules 1950".

2. In these rules :

- (a) "Regulation" means the Baluchistan Opium-Smoking Regulation, 1950.
- (b) expressions defined in the Regulation and used herein have the same meanings respectively as in the Regulation.

3. A person who was addicted to opium smoking on the 29th September 1950, and who desires to be exempted from the operation of sub-section (1) of section 3 of the Regulation, may apply in writing to the Collector of the district in which he ordinarily resides or to the Superintendent of Excise in Baluchistan for registration of his name as an opium smoker and for the grant of a permit exempting him from the operation of the said provision.

4. An application made under rule 3 shall be accompanied by a certificate from two respectable persons and countersigned by the Civil Surgeon or the Medical Officer of the district in which the applicant ordinarily resides that the applicant was addicted to opium smoking on the 29th September 1950, and that he cannot live without opium smoking. Every such application shall specify the place of residence of the applicant.

5. The Collector or the Superintendent of Excise in Baluchistan receiving such application shall, if satisfied, that the applicant was addicted to smoking opium on the 29th September 1950, and that he cannot live without smoking opium register the applicant and issue him with a permit in the Form appended to these rules.

6. Every Collector shall maintain a register of opium smokers exempted in his district and the Superintendent of Excise in Baluchistan shall maintain such register for the whole of the Province.

7. A registered smoker shall perform all the operations connected with opium smoking himself without the assistance of any other individual.

8. A registered smoker shall not smoke in company.

9. A registered smoker shall smoke only at the place of his residence specified in the application under rule 3 or such other place as may have been notified to, and approved by the officer issuing the permit.

10. A registered smoker may, for his personal use, manufacture and have in his possession any quantity of prepared opium, not exceeding one-fourth of a tola, provided that such prepared opium has been manufactured from opium lawfully possessed by him for his own consumption.

11. A registered smoker shall be bound to produce the permit issued to him whenever so required by an Excise Officer not below the rank of a Sub-Inspector.

12. Any breach of these rules shall render the permit liable to cancellation and in addition the smoker shall be liable to any penalty or punishment to which he may be subject under the Regulation or the rules made thereunder.

1. All rewards shall be paid out of the budget allot-

whether in paying informers or in other ways, (2) for
conspicuous energy, intelligence, or courage dis-
played in the detection of offences or (3) to compen-

suffered by him in the detection of offences. Where
these conditions are satisfied the rewards may be
granted irrespective of the result of a trial and with-
out direct relation to the quantity or value of the
material seized.

- the occupier or occupiers of these requisitioned premises and all persons residing therein shall vacate them whenever directed, and hand over the vacant possession of the same to the person authorised by this department for this purpose;
- in case the immediate possession of these requisitioned premises is not required to be taken by the Government and the occupant or occupants intend to vacate them, they shall send a written intimation of their such intention, as to reach the undersigned seven days before the date on which the premises are actually vacated; and
- the owner of the building shall not dispose of these requisitioned premises or part
