REMARKS

During the week ending the 2nd December, 1950, in the Dominion of Pakistan (excluding 7 towns of the Punjab Province), the total number of deaths recorded in 35 towns having a population of over 30,000 was 1147. The mid-year estimated population of these towns was 4,773,175 and the death rate per thousand was 12.4. The births in the same towns numbered 2,592 giving a birth rate of 28.2 per thousand of the population.

In 35 towns of the Dominion of Pakistan, there were 12 deaths from cholera and 18 deaths from smallpox. The deaths from cholera were recorded in Rajshahi 4, Khulna 3, Dacca and Narayanganj 2 each and Barisal 1. The deaths from smallpox were recorded in Barisal 10, Serajganj and Khulna 3 each Narayanganj and Sukkur 1 each.

Plague was absent during the week.
