

H., dated the 6th January 1951, for prevention and control of cholera and for the medical inspection, isolation, observation and surveillance of persons suffering from or suspected of being infected with cholera in the said district will remain in force for a period of three months with effect from 6th April 1951.

NOTIFICATION

No. 965 L.S.-G.—27th March 1951.—The following draft rules which in exercise of the powers conferred by clauses (d) and (e) of section 138 of the Bengal Local Self-Government Act, 1885 (Bengal Act III of 1885), and in supersession of the existing rules 91 to 103, made under the notification, dated the 11th February 1886, the Governor proposes to make are published for the information of persons likely to be affected thereby.

2. The draft rules will be taken into consideration on or after the 1st August 1951, and any objection or suggestion with respect thereto which may be received by the undersigned before that date will be duly considered:—

Draft Rules regulating the power of District Board to transfer property and make contracts.

Transfer of Property.

1. Property in the transfer of which a District Board is, for the purposes of these rules, to be held to be concerned, is either (a) movable or immovable property vested in the Board; or (b) immovable property placed by the Provincial Government under the control and administration of the Board.

2. In respect of immovable property placed by the Act, or by the Governor in accordance with the provisions of the Act, under the control and administration of the District Board, the relation of the Board to the Provincial Government is that of agent to principal, whether or not the rents or profits accruing from that property are credited in whole or in part to the District Fund.

3. No immovable property vested in a District Board, or placed by the Provincial Government under the control and administration of the Board, shall, except with the previous approval of the Provincial Government, and in such manner and on such terms and conditions as that Government may approve, be transferred by the Board by way of sale, or mortgage or charge, or exchange, or otherwise than by way of lease.

4. A lease of immovable property vested in District Board or placed by the Provincial Government under the control and administration of the Board, may be made by the Board, with or without premium, subject to the following conditions, namely:—

- (a) That a reasonable annual rent shall be reserved and made payable during the whole of the term of the lease;
- (b) That the lease or agreement for the lease shall not be made for any term without the previous sanction of the Board at a meeting, or for any term exceeding five years and not exceeding ten years without the previous approval of the Collector of the district, or for any term exceeding ten years and not exceeding thirty years without the previous approval of the Commissioner of the Division, or for any term exceeding thirty years without the previous approval of the Provincial Government; and
- (c) That the lease contain a specific provision reserving the right of the Board to resume the property before the expiry of the term whenever required for Board's purpose and in case of such resumption the rent for the unexpired period will not be payable, and moreover if any premium was realised, a proportionate amount shall be refunded.

5. Any movable property vested in a District Board may be transferred by the Board in any way and on any terms which the Board may, by resolution at a meeting, determine to be expedient and reasonable.

6. Every transfer of immovable property vested in a District Board shall be made by an instrument under the common seal of the Board, signed by the Chairman and by two of the members of the Board, and where these rules require the previous approval of the Collector, or of the Commissioner of the Division, or of the Provincial Government the fact that the transfer is signed with such approval shall be distinctly expressed.

7. Every transfer of property placed by the Provincial Government under the control and administration of a District Board shall, unless the Provincial Government in any case otherwise direct, be made by an instrument under the common seal of the Board, signed by the Chairman and by two of the members of the Board, and expressed to be signed on behalf of Government, and when these rules require such approval, expressed to be so signed with the previous approval, as

the case may be, of the Collector of the district, or of the Commissioner of the Division, or of the Provincial Government.

Contracts.

8. Every contract or agreement entered into by a District Board in respect of a sum, or involving a value, above Rs. 500 shall be sanctioned at a meeting, be in writing, be signed by the Chairman and two other members of the Board, and shall be sealed with the common seal of the Board. Unless so sanctioned and executed, such contract shall not be binding on the District Board.

The draft amendments issued under notification No. 1407 L. S.-G., dated the 25th May 1950, and published in the *Dacca Gazette*, Part I, page 440, dated the 1st June 1950, are hereby rescinded.



The rate of labour per day without food varied from Rs. 2.8 to annas 12. The highest rate was prevailing in Rangpur Sadar, while the lowest was in Pergur Subdivision.

Supplementary Review of the Jute Crop of East Bengal, for 1950-51

Area.—There has been no change in acreage under jute since the publication of the Final Forecast in September last. In the Final Forecast total acreage for the two varieties of jute together was shown. In accordance with the latest instructions of the Central Government acreages and the yields for the two varieties of jute, *viz.*, *olitorius* and *capsularis* have been separately shown in this review. The areas under *olitorius* and *capsularis* varieties thus stand at 277,400 acres and 972,665 acres respectively. The total area for the province stands at 1,250,065 acres as shown in the final forecast. Districtwise areas are shown in appendix I.

Yield.—The yield rate for each district was arrived at on the basis of the circumstances existing up to the early part of September. At the time there was acute shortage of steeping water in most of the districts and sufficient number of crop-cutting experiments on the *olitorius* variety could not be conducted; because this variety does not completely mature up in all districts by the middle of September, when the final forecast of the crop is issued. The harvesting of the crop in some areas was delayed. There were good showers in October, which improved both the quality and the rate of yield of the fibre. The present estimates of the fibre prepared on the basis of the circumstances prevailing prior and subsequent to the time of publication of the final forecast show an increase of 96,315 bales over the total output of the fibre shown in the final forecast for 1950 season. The amounts of fibre now estimated for the two varieties of *olitorius* and *capsularis* jute stand at 1,088,515 bales and 3,363,940 bales respectively. The total yield of the fibre for the province for the two varieties together thus stands at 4,452,455 bales in 1950-51. Districtwise yields are shown in appendix II.
