

In exercise of the powers conferred by Section 43 of the Chittagong Port Act 1914 (Bengal Act V of 1914), and with the previous sanction of the Central

Government, the Commissioners for the Port of Chittagong hereby notify for general information:—



REMARKS

During the week ending 1st August, 1953, in 35 towns having a population 30,000 and over the total number of deaths recorded was 867. The 1951-Census population of these towns was 3,214,090 and the death rate per thousand was 14·0. The births in the same towns numbered 1949, giving a birth rate 31·5 per thousand of population.

In these 35 towns of Pakistan, there were 3 deaths from Small-pox and two deaths from Cholera. The deaths from Smallpox were recorded in Lahore, Jhang, Maghiana and Multan one each and those from Cholera were recorded one each in Barisal and Khulna.


Plague was absent during the week under report.
