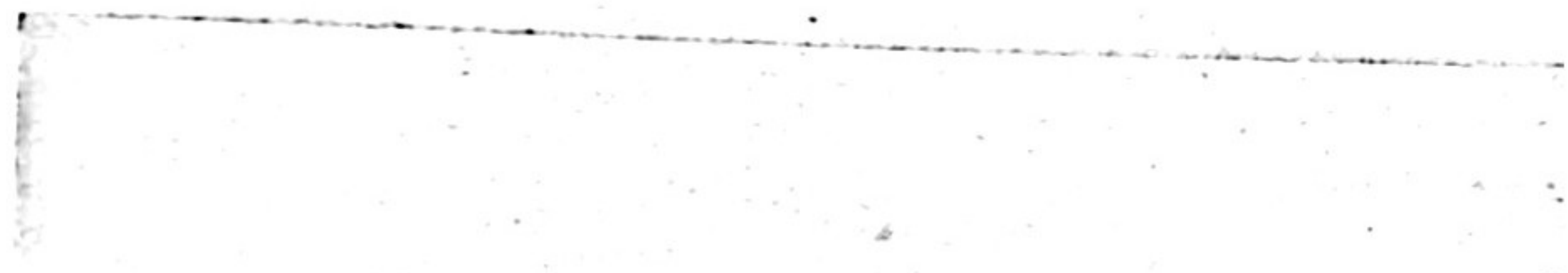
2. Wholesale prices shall be fixed at a maximum of 92½% of the above mentioned prices.
