THE HON'BLE THE AGENT TO THE GOVERNOR-GENERAL AND CHIEF COMMISSIONER IN BALUCHISTAN

Quetta, the 28th December 1953

No. 1570-Estt. 6914/Edn.—In exercise of the powers conferred on him by Rule 44 of the Civil Services (Classification, Central and Appeal) Rules and in supersession of all previous orders on the subject but subject to the provisions of his Notification No. 5566, dated the 27th November 1933, the Agent to the Governor-General and Chief Commissioner in Baluchistan is pleased to make the following rules for the Baluchistan Subordinate Educational Service :—

1. (1) These rules may be called the Baluchistan Subordinate Educational Service Rules, 1953.

(2) These rules shall come into force at once.

2. In these rules, unless there is anything repugnant in the subject or context :—

- (1) 'Government' means the Agent to the Governor-General and Chief Commissioner in Baluchistan.
- (2) 'Service' means the Baluchistan Subordinate Educational Service.
- (3) 'Recognised University' means any University incorporated by law in Pakistan, or any other University which may be declared to be a recognised University for the purposes of these Rules.
- (4) 'Recognised College, Recognised School, Recognised Institution' means any College, School and Institution as the case may be, recognised by the Government of Pakistan or by a recognised University and includes Institutions which may, by a formal order, be recognised by the Head of Department.
- (5) 'Head of Department' means the Director of Education in Baluchistan.
- (6) 'Direct Recruitment' means recruitment other than by promotion or by transfer from the Service.
- (7) 'Board' means the Selection Committee of not less than three members to be nominated by the Head of Department provided that the Selection Committee for recruitment of women to the Service shall consist of women members of the Service.

PART I

3. The Service shall comprise of the following posts :—

I. COLLEGE SECTION

- (1) Junior Lecturers.
- (2) Demonstrators.
- (3) Physical Training Supervisors and Instructors.
- (4) Librarians.
- (5) Assistant Librarians.
- (6) Janitors for Libraries.
- (7) Laboratory Assistants.

II. SCHOOL SECTION

- (1) Assistant District Inspector of Schools.
- (2) Head Masters of Middle Schools.
- (3) Head Mistresses of Middle Schools.
- (4) Senior English Teachers.
- (5) Assistant Masters, Government Teachers'

- (6) Science Teachers.
- (7) Agriculture Teachers.
- (8) Junior Anglo-Vernacular Mistresses.
- (9) Drawing Masters.
- (10) Senior Vernacular Teachers.
- (11) Physical Training Instructors.
- (12) Junior Vernacular Teachers.
- (13) Manual Training Instructors.
- (14) Practical Arts Teachers.
- (15) Weaving and Dyeing Instructors.
- (16) Domestic Science Teachers.

provided that Government may change the number designation and classification etc., of the posts, either temporarily or permanently.

4. The service shall be recruited as laid down in Parts II to VI of these Rules.

5. Subject to the provisions of Rule 4, Government may determine the method or methods to be employed for the purpose of filling any particular vacancy or vacancies as may be required to be filled during any particular period and the number of candidates to be recruited by each method.

PART II

6. The rules contained in this Part shall apply to appointment by direct recruitment.

7. (1) Subject to the rules contained in this or any other Part, the following persons shall be eligible to apply for a post in the Service :—

- (i) Every citizen of Pakistan who is :—
 - (a) a member of a tribe and is permanently residing in Baluchistan, or
 - (b) a domiciled resident of Baluchistan holding a certificate under the Pakistan Citizenship Act (Act II of 1951) issued by a District Magistrate in Baluchistan or a certificate issued by a District Magistrate in Baluchistan in accordance with the rules in force prior to the promulgation of the Pakistan Citizenship Act.
- (ii) Any person, being a citizen of Pakistan already in employment in any Department of the Baluchistan Administration, provided he is recommended by the Head of the office in which he is serving, subject in each case to the sanction of the Head of Department.

(2) Notwithstanding anything contained in Clause (1) of this Rule, the Head of Department may, in his discretion, relax the condition of domicile in individual cases.

8. A candidate, who wishes to be appointed to the Service, must apply before such date, in such manner and in such form as the Head of Department may prescribe.

9. If a candidate is already in Government Service in any other Department on the date of his application, he shall submit his application through the Head of office in which he is serving.

10. A candidate must satisfy the Head of Department that his character is such as to make him suitable for appointment to the Service. A candidate who cannot do so, shall not be eligible for appointment to the Service.

11. No recommendations except those invited in the prescribed form of application, shall be taken into consideration. Any attempt on the part of any candidate to obtain support for his candidature is

12. The candidates, who are eligible for appointment in accordance with the rules contained in this Part and the other Parts, will be summoned to appear before a Board for an interview at such place, time and date as may be prescribed by the Head of Department.

13. The Head of Department may prescribe the principles, which the Board shall keep in view, when interviewing candidates and shall inform the Board of the maximum number of candidates to be recommended for appointment.

14. The Board shall, after interviewing the candidates, recommend to the Head of Department, candidates, who are suitable for recruitment to the Service.

15. A list of candidates selected by the Head of Department for appointment shall be made out in order of merit as disclosed by the aggregate marks finally awarded to each candidate by the Board.

16. A candidate must be in good mental and bodily health and free from any physical defect likely to interfere with the discharge of his duties as an officer of the Service. A candidate, who (after such medical examination as the Head of Department may prescribe) is found not to satisfy these requirements will not be appointed.

17. If power to make appointments in the Service is delegated by Government to any other officer, that officer may exercise any of the powers under this Part of the Rules.

PART III

18. The Rules contained in this Part shall apply to the posts mentioned in Rule 20.

19. Appointment to the posts may be made either by promotion from among the members of the Service or by direct recruitment.

20. (1) Candidates for the following posts must possess the qualifications given against each post:—

Name of Post,	Qualification required
i) Junior Lecturers ...	(a) At least M. A. or M.Sc. degree from a recognised University in the Second Division or Class. (b) Three years' teaching experience in a recognised College or Institution.
ii) Demonstrators ...	(a) At least B.Sc. in the subject in the Second Division or Class from a recognised University. (b) Practical experience as a Science Teacher or Demonstrator in a recognised Institution or College for at least three years.
iii) Physical Training Supervisors.	(a) At least a degree in Arts or Science from a recognised University. (b) A degree or diploma (Senior Course) from a recognised Physical Training College or Institution.
iv) Librarians ...	(a) At least a degree from a recognised University. (b) A degree or diploma in Librarianship from a recognised Institution.
v) Assistant Librarians ...	(a) At least a Matriculate or one who has passed an equivalent, or higher examination from a recognised University or Institution. (b) Diploma in Library Science from a recognised Institution.
vi) Janitors for Libraries ...	(a) At least a Matriculate or one who has passed an equivalent or higher examination from a recognised University or Institution.
vii) Laboratory Assistants ...	At least a Matriculate or one who has passed an equivalent or higher Examination from a recognised University or Institution.

(2) A candidate, who is not already a member of the Service must be between the age of 20 and 30 years but the Head of Department may, in his discretion, relax the condition of age in individual cases.

(3) Notwithstanding anything contained in Clause (1) of this Rule the Head of Department may, in his discretion, relax the condition of experience in individual cases.

21. (1) A candidate, who is not already a member of the Service, will remain on probation for a period of two years from the date of his appointment or until there is a permanent vacancy whichever is later, provided that the Head of Department may, in his discretion, extend the period of probation.

(2) If, in the opinion of the Head of Department, the work or conduct of such a candidate during the period of probation is unsatisfactory or shows that he is not likely to become efficient, the Head of Department may discharge him forthwith.

22. A candidate, who is already a member of the Service, shall, on appointment to the post, also remain on probation for a period of two years or until there is a permanent vacancy, whichever is later, and until he is confirmed in the post he shall be deemed to have been appointed until further orders.

23. If at any time it appears necessary to the Head of Department so to do, in the interest of Public Service, he may appoint a person, who does not possess the qualifications laid down in Rule 20, provided that if the period of appointment exceeds six months, the prior approval of Government will be obtained. Such appointment shall be in an officiating and temporary capacity only and shall be deemed to be until further orders.

PART IV.

24. The Rules contained in this Part shall apply to the posts of Junior Vernacular Teachers only.

25. Candidates for the post of Junior Vernacular Teacher must have passed the Middle School Examination from any recognised School or its equivalent or higher examination and must be between the age of 17 and 23 years.

26. Candidates for the post of Junior Vernacular Teacher, who apply in accordance with the provisions of Rule 8, shall be required to appear in an examination to be called Entrance Examination which will be conducted under the directions of the Head of Department.

27. Candidates must pay such examination fees as the Head of Department may prescribe. No claim for a refund of any of these fees will be entertained.

28. Candidates, who are admitted to the Entrance Examination, shall be required to appear in the following subjects:—

Subject	Marks	Time allowed
1. Urdu Dictation ...	20	Half an hour.
2. Urdu Essay Writing ...	30	One hour.
3. Arithmetic ...	30	One hour.
4. General Knowledge ...	20	Half an hour.

29. Notwithstanding anything contained in Rule 12, no candidate for the post of Junior Vernacular Teacher shall be summoned to appear before the Board who has obtained less than 40% marks in the Entrance Examination.

30. The names of the candidates selected for appointment as Junior Vernacular Teacher in accordance with Rule 15 will be placed on a Waiting List to be called "The List of accepted candidates". All permanent vacancies in the cadre of Junior Vernacular Teachers will eventually be filled from the List of accepted candidates in order of seniority on the list, provided that the work and conduct of the candidate during the period of probation has been satisfactory and provided he is eligible for being appointed to a permanent vacancy in accordance with the Rules contained in this Part.

31. All candidates on the List of accepted candidates referred to in the previous Rule shall be required to undergo a period of training in the Government Teachers' Training School, Quetta.

32. Candidates shall complete the training in the Government Teachers' Training School, Quetta, in not more than three consecutive sessions provided that the Head of Department may, in his discretion and for reasons to be recorded in writing, allow a candidate more than three sessions in which to pass the examination. If a candidate does not appear in an examination in a session in which he has been allowed to appear, he shall be assumed to have availed of that session.

33. A candidate for the post of Junior Vernacular Teacher shall remain on probation for a period of two years or until there is a permanent vacancy, whichever is later; provided that no candidate shall be confirmed as Junior Vernacular Teacher unless he has successfully completed the training in the Government Teachers' Training School, Quetta, or has obtained a Special Teachers' Certificate from the Department of Education.

34. If, in the opinion of the Head of Department the work or conduct of a candidate on probation, i.e., before his confirmation as Junior Vernacular Teacher, is unsatisfactory or shows that he is not likely to become efficient or if the candidate has failed to successfully complete the training in the Government Teachers' Training School, Quetta, or has failed to obtain the Special Teachers' Certificate from the Department of Education, the Head of Department may discharge him forthwith.

PART V

35. The Rules contained in this Part shall apply to the posts mentioned in Rule 36.

36. Candidates for the posts must possess the qualifications given against each post:—

(vi) Senior English Teachers	(a) Graduate from a recognised University. (b) A degree or diploma in teaching from a recognised Institution or equivalent certificate issued by the Head of Department.
(vii) Assistant Masters, Government Teachers' Training School, Quetta.	(a) Graduate from a recognised University. (b) A degree or diploma in teaching from a recognised Institution or equivalent certificate issued by the Head of Department.
(viii) Science Masters	(a) B.Sc. Degree from a recognised University. (b) A degree or diploma in teaching from a recognised Institution or equivalent certificate issued by the Head of Department.
(ix) Agriculture Teacher	(a) B.Sc. (Agric.) from a recognised University. (b) A degree or diploma in teaching from a recognised Institution.
(x) Manual Training Instructors.	(a) Matriculate of a recognised University or one who has passed an equivalent or a higher examination from a recognised Institution. (b) A certificate in the subject from recognised Institution.
(xi) Practical Arts Teachers	(a) Matriculate of a recognised University or one who has passed an equivalent or a higher examination from a recognised Institution. (b) A certificate in the subject from recognised Institution.
(xii) Weaving and Dyeing Instructors.	(a) Matriculate of a recognised University or one who has passed an equivalent or a higher examination from a recognised Institution. (b) A certificate in the subject from recognised Institution.
(xiii) Domestic Science Teachers.	(a) Matriculate of a recognised University or one who has passed an equivalent or higher examination from a recognised Institution. (b) A certificate in the subject from recognised Institution.

37. (1) Appointment to the posts shall be made by promotion from among the members of the Service.

(2) If there is no suitable candidate in the Service for appointment to the posts, the Head of Department may appoint a person by direct recruitment.

38. A candidate, who is appointed by direct recruitment must be between the age of 20 and 30 years, but the Head of Department may, in his discretion, relax the condition of age in individual cases.

39. (1) A candidate, who is appointed by direct recruitment will remain on probation for a period of two years from the date of his appointment or until there is a permanent vacancy whichever is later, provided that the Head of Department may, in his discretion, extend this period.

(2) If, in the opinion of the Head of Department, the work or conduct of such a candidate during the period of probation is unsatisfactory or shows that he is not likely to become efficient, the Head of Department may discharge him forthwith.

40. A candidate, who is already a member of the Service, shall, on appointment to the post, also remain on probation for a period of two years or until there is a permanent vacancy whichever is later and until he is confirmed in the post, he shall be deemed to have been appointed until further orders.

41. If, at any time, it appears necessary to the Head of Department so to do, in the interest of public service, he may appoint a person who does not possess the qualifications laid down in Rules 36 provided that if the period of appointment exceeds six months the prior approval of Government will be obtained. Such appointment shall be in officiating and temporary capacity only and shall be deemed to be until further orders.

PART VI.

42. The Rules contained in this Part shall apply to the posts of Assistant District Inspectors of Schools, Head Masters and Head-Mistresses of Middle Schools.

43. Appointment to the posts shall be made by promotions from the grade of Senior English Teachers, Assistant Masters, Government Teachers' Training School, Quetta, Science Teachers and Agriculture Teachers.

44. Such appointments will be made by selection on merit, Seniority playing its part only when other things are equal.

45. Seniority as between the incumbents of these posts shall be fixed in the order in which selection for promotion has been made by the Head of Department.

46. All officers, who are appointed to officiate as Assistant District Inspectors of Schools, Head Masters and Head Mistresses of Middle Schools in a temporary or officiating capacity and until such time as they are confirmed as such, shall be deemed to have been appointed until further orders.

REMARKS

During the week ending the 5th December, 1953 in 13 towns in Pakistan (excluding Sind, East Bengal and 11 towns in the Punjab) having a population of 30,000 and over, the total number of deaths recorded was 522. The 1951 Census population of these towns was 2,462,679 and the death rate per thousand was 11.0. The births in the same towns numbered 1,940 giving a birth rate of 40.9 per thousand of population.

In these 13 towns of Pakistan only four deaths from small-pox were recorded. These deaths were recorded in Rawalpindi city in the Punjab.

Cholera and Plague remained absent during the week under report.
