PART V—Acts of Constituent Assembly (Legislature) assented to by the Governor-General, Acts of Constituent Assembly of Pakistan and Ordinances promulgated by the Governor-General.

GOVERNMENT OF PAKISTAN.

CONSTITUENT ASSEMBLY (LEGISLATURE).

✓ ACT XXI OF 1953.

An Act to continue for a limited period the Railways (Transport of Goods) Act, 1947.

WHEREAS it is expedient to continue for a limited period the Railways (Transport of Goods) Act, 1947;

It is hereby enacted as follows:—

1. **Short title and commencement.**—(1) This Act may be called the Railways (Transport of Goods) (Continuance) Act, 1953.

(2) It shall come into force on the twenty-fifth day of March, 1954.

2. **Continuance of Act XII of 1947.**—(1) The Railways (Transport of Goods) Act, 1947, is hereby continued in force, subject to the provisions of sub-section (2) of this section.

(2) In sub-section (3) of section 1 of that Act, for the word "seven" the word "ten" shall be substituted.

✓ ACT No. XXXI of 1953.

An Act to provide for the regulation, administration and accounting of collections of charitable donations and for the prevention of frauds.

WHEREAS it is expedient to provide for the regulation, administration and accounting of collections of charitable donations and for the prevention of frauds;

It is hereby enacted as follows:—

1. **Short title, extent and commencement.**—(1) This Act may be called the Charitable Funds (Regulation of Collections) Act, 1953.

(2) It shall come into force at once.

2. Amendment of clause 5, the State Bank of Pakistan Order, 1948.—In clause 5 of the State Bank of Pakistan Order, 1948 (hereinafter referred to as the Order),—

(a) for sub-clause (4) the following shall be substituted, namely:—

“(4) Notwithstanding anything contained in the Acts hereinafter mentioned in this sub-clause, the shares of the Bank shall be deemed to be included among the securities enumerated in section 20 of the Trusts Act, 1882, and to be approved securities for the purposes of the Insurance Act, 1938, and the Banking Companies (Control) Act, 1948.”;

(b) after sub-clause (6) the following new sub-clause shall be inserted, namely:—

“(6A) The shares of the Bank may be held under his official designation by the holder of any public office which may be notified in the *Gazette* by the Local Board, and in regard to transfers the following provisions shall apply, namely—

(a) when a share is so held, it shall be deemed to be transferred without any or further endorsement or transfer deed from each holder of the office to the succeeding holder of the office on and from the date on which the latter takes charge of the office;

(b) when the holder of the office transfers the share to a party not being his successor in office, the transfer shall be made in the prescribed manner;

(c) the provisions of parts (a) and (b) of this sub-clause apply in the case of an office of which there are two or more joint holders as they apply to an office of which there is a single holder.”.

3. Insertion of new clause 5A, the State Bank of Pakistan Order, 1948.—After clause 5 of the Order, the following new clause shall be inserted and shall be deemed always to have been inserted, namely:—

“5A. No notice of any trust, express, implied or constructive, shall be acted upon or receivable by the Bank.”.

4. Amendment of clause 26, the State Bank of Pakistan Order, 1948.—In clause 26 of the Order, for parts (b) to (e) of sub-clause (2), the following shall be substituted, namely:—

“(b) the amount of money borrowed by it from the Bank;

(c) the total amount of money held by it in Pakistan, in the form of notes and coin;

(d) the balance held by it at the Bank;

(e) the balances held by it at other banks in current account and the money at call and short notice in Pakistan;

(f) the investments (at book value) separately, in Central Government Securities including Treasury Bills, in Provincial Government Securities including Treasury Bills, and in others;

(g) the amount of advances made and of the bills discounted in Pakistan, separately.”.

(2) It shall come into force at once.

2. Amendment of section 24, Act I of 1949.—In section 24 of the Pakistan Industrial Finance Corporation Act, 1949, hereinafter referred to as the said Act, in sub-section (1), for clause (a) the following shall be substituted, namely:—

“(a) guaranteeing loans, debts, and credits raised or incurred by or granted to an industrial concern and repayable within a period not exceeding twenty years, the guarantee being given on such terms and conditions as may be agreed upon with the concern;”.

3. Amendment of section 29, Act I of 1949.—To section 29 of the said Act, the following new sub-section shall be added at the end, namely:—

“(5) All sums due to the Corporation shall be recoverable as arrears of land revenue:

Provided that no sum shall be so recovered unless three months' notice has first been given by the Corporation to the debtor that the sum will be so recovered:

Provided further that in so giving notice the Corporation shall inform the debtor that he may pay by such instalments as may be fixed in the notice and that upon his so paying every instalment on or before the due day the recovery will be suspended but that it will otherwise proceed as to the entire sum outstanding in case of any default in any instalment including the first.”.

4. Amendment of section 36, Act I of 1949.—In sub-section (3) of section 36 of the said Act, for the word “two” the word “three” shall be substituted.

5. Amendment of section 43, Act I of 1949.—In section 43 of the said Act,—

(a) the following new clause shall be added after clause (k) in sub-section (2):—

“(kk) the recruitment of officers and staff of the Corporation, the terms and conditions of their service, the constitution and management of provident funds for the officers and staff of the Corporation and all matters connected with any of these things;”.

(b) For sub-section (3) the following shall be substituted, namely:—

“(3) All regulations made under this section shall come into force on the date specified in each case, and shall be published in the *Official Gazette* and shall also be laid on the table of the Central Legislature.”.

✓ ACT No. XXXIII of 1953.

An Act further to amend the Tariff Act, 1934.

WHEREAS it is expedient further to amend the Tariff Act, 1934, for the purposes hereinafter appearing;

It is hereby enacted as follows:—

1. **Short title and commencement.**—(1) This Act may be called the Tariff (Second Amendment) Act, 1953.

(2) It shall come into force at once.

2. **Amendment of First Schedule Act XXXII of 1934.**—In the First Schedule to the Tariff Act, 1934, the following additions and alterations shall be made, namely:—

(1) in the first column the following entry shall be added after item 28(18), namely:—

“28(19)”;

and against that entry shall be inserted in the second column the words “Sodium silicate”, in the third column the word “Protective”, in the fourth column the figures and words “60 per cent. *ad valorem.*”, and in the fifth column the word, figures and comma “April 7, 1956.”;

(2) the words and comma “sodium silicate,” shall be deleted from the entry in the second column against item 28(8);

(3) in the first column the following entry shall be added after item 71(9), namely:—

“71(10)”;

and against that entry shall be inserted in the second column the word “Locks”, in the third column the word “Protective”, in the fourth column the figures and words “80 per cent. *ad valorem.*”, and in the fifth column the word, figures and comma “July 3, 1956.”;

(4) for the entry in the fifth column against item 73(7) the following shall be substituted, namely:—

“March 31, 1954”.

3. The additional duties of customs referred to in section 4 of the Finance Act, 1953 (I of 1953), shall not be levied or collected on the goods comprised in items 28(19) and 71(10) of the First Schedule to the Tariff Act, 1934 (XXXII of 1934), added thereto by clauses (1) and (3) of the previous section.

4. **Repeal of Act XXV of 1947.**—The Indian Tariff (Amendment) Act, 1947, is hereby repealed.

An Act to amend the Pakistan Industrial Development Corporation Act, 1950.

WHEREAS it is expedient to amend the Pakistan Industrial Development Corporation Act, 1950, in the manner hereinafter appearing;

It is hereby enacted as follows:—

1. **Short title and commencement.**—(1) This Act may be called the Pakistan Industrial Development Corporation (Amendment) Act, 1953.

(2) It shall come into force at once.

2. **Amendment of Act XLV of 1950.**—In section 6 of the Pakistan Industrial Development Corporation Act, 1950, to sub-section (2), the following proviso shall be added, namely:—

"Provided that the Central Government may in exceptional circumstances where it considers it necessary to do so in the public interest exempt by a special order any person who has been appointed or is about to be appointed a Director from the application of clauses (a) and (c) of this sub-section."

✓ ACT No. XL of 1953.

An Act further to amend the Pakistan Rehabilitation Ordinance, 1948.

WHEREAS it is expedient further to amend the Pakistan Rehabilitation Ordinance, 1948 (XIX of 1948), for the purposes hereinafter appearing;

It is hereby enacted as follows:—

1. **Short title and commencement.**—(1) This Act may be called the Pakistan Rehabilitation (Amendment) Act, 1953.

(2) It shall come into force at once.

2. **Amendment of section 13, Ordinance XIX of 1948.**—In sub-section (4) of section 13 of the Pakistan Rehabilitation Ordinance, 1948 (XIX of 1948), hereinafter referred to as "the said Ordinance" after the words "own motion or on", the words "perusal of an" shall be inserted, and after the words "and may", the words "after perusal of the record and without hearing any person or his counsel or authorized agent" shall be inserted.

3. **Amendment of section 13A, Ordinance XIX of 1948, etc.**—(1) In section 13A of the said Ordinance, for sub-section (2) and the proviso, the following sub-section shall be substituted, and shall be deemed to have been so substituted on the twentieth day of April, 1951, namely:—

"(2) A revision petition made in pursuance of sub-section (1) may, after such enquiry as may be considered necessary, be disposed of by the

5. **Substitution of new section 8, Act XXXVI of 1952.**—For section 8 of the said Act, the following shall be substituted, namely:

"8. Subject to the provisions of this Act, an officer of the Pakistan Armed Forces Nursing Service shall be bound to undergo such training and in such manner and to perform such duties in connection with the forces and persons subject to any of the enactments referred to in section 4 as may be laid down by regulations.".

6. **Substitution of new section 9, Act XXXVI of 1952.**—For section 9 of the said Act, the following shall be substituted, namely:

"9. (1) The provisions of the Indian Army Act, 1911 (VIII of 1911), or any enactment which replaces that Act shall, to such extent and subject to such adaptations and modifications as may be prescribed, apply to officers of the Pakistan Armed Forces Nursing Service, who may be serving with forces and persons subject to that Act or enactment as those provisions apply to officers of the Pakistan Army.

(2) The provisions of the Indian Air Force Act, 1932 (XIV of 1932), or any enactment which replaces that Act shall, to such extent and subject to such adaptations and modifications as may be prescribed, apply to officers of the Pakistan Armed Forces Nursing Service, who may be serving with forces and persons subject to that Act or enactment, as those provisions apply to officers of the Royal Pakistan Air Force.

(3) The provisions of the Pakistan Navy (Discipline) Act, 1934 (XXXIV of 1934), shall to such extent and subject to such adaptations and modifications as may be prescribed, apply to officers of the Pakistan Armed Forces Nursing Service, who may be serving with forces and persons subject to that Act, as those provisions apply to officers of the Royal Pakistan Navy.".

7. **Amendment of section 11, Act XXXVI of 1952.**—In section 11 of the said Act, for the words "the Commander-in-Chief of the Pakistan Army" the words "the Director General of Medical Services" shall be substituted.

The Second Forecast of the Cotton Crop of East Bengal for 1953-54.

[Note:—According to the Final Forecast of last year (1952-53) the area under Cotton in East Bengal represented some 1.7 per cent. of the total area in the whole of Pakistan. Two varieties of the crop (viz., Early and late) grown in East Bengal. The Cotton grown in this province is mostly short staple variety. This forecast deals with the area sown and the present condition of the crop and it covers the period from April to the end of September).

Character of the Season :—It has already been stated in the first forecast of the crop that the weather and its effect on the crops have been favourable and there is no remarkable change of weather since the submission of the first forecast. The present condition of the crop is satisfactory and a good outturn is expected.

Acreage :—The total areas sown with the early and late varieties are estimated at 58,275 acres and 45 acres this year, as against 58,175 acres 245 acres shown in both the corresponding and final forecast respectively of last year. Slight increase in area is mainly due to reclamation of waste land.

determine, such uniform, armlets and badges shall be supplied by the Provincial Government free of cost and shall at the discretion of the Provincial Government be replaced at such intervals as the Provincial Government may decide. Badges with Brassards and A.R.P. shoulder letters which may be included in such equipment shall be supplied by the Provincial Government free of cost, to all classes of officers also. Armlets and other articles of uniform which shall be supplied by the Provincial Government will remain the property of the Provincial Government. When a member or an officer of a service leaves the service he shall immediately deliver to the Staff Officer of his service, the uniform, armlet, badge and equipment supplied to him. The Staff Officer himself shall deliver such items of equipment to the Controller. The Controller may fix a sum to be recovered in the event of a member or an officer of a service failing through negligence, or as a result of having misused any article or equipment entrusted to him, to return such article or equipment or returning it in a damaged condition.

(2) The service when on duty and when so directed by the Controller or other appropriate authority, as the case may be, shall carry such equipment as may be ordered by the Controller or such authority.
