REMARKS

During the week ending the 17th April, 1954, in 26 towns of Pakistan (excluding Karachi, Sind and 10 towns of the Punjab Province) having a population of 30,000 and over, the total number of deaths recorded was 469. The 1951-Census population of these towns was 2,605,049 and the death rate per thousand was 9.3. The births in the same towns numbered 1,118, giving a birth rate of 22.3 per thousand of population.

In the above-mentioned towns of Pakistan there were 17 deaths from cholera. The deaths from cholera were recorded in Khulna 10, Dacca, Narayanganj 3 each and Chittagong one.

Small-pox and plague remained absent during the week under report.
