Tippera.—No. 15421 L. A.—1st October 1955.—The following agreement is published under section 42 of the Land Acquisition Act (I of 1894), for general information:—

## Agreement.

Memorandum of agreement made this 29th day of September 1955 between the Gunabati Union Samabaya Multipurpose Samity Ltd., a Samity (registered under the Bengal Co-operative Societies Act, 1940) (Bengal Act XXI of 1940) and having its registered office at Gunabati in the district of Tippera (hereinafter called the Samity) of the one part and the Governor of the Province of East Bengal (hereinafter called the Governor) of the other part.

Whereas for the purpose of the construction of storage the Samity has applied to the Government

of East Bengal for the acquisition under the provisions of the Land Acquisition Act, 1894 of the piece or parcel of the land containing 0.08 of an acre or thereabout situated in the village of Gunabati in the district of Tippera and more particularly described in the schedule hereto and delineated in the plan (Not printed but may be inspected in the office of the Collector of Tippera) hereunto annexed.

And whereas the said Government of East Bengal, being satisfied by an enquiry held under section 40 of the said Act that the proposed acquisition is needed for the aforesaid purpose and that the said work is likely to prove useful to the public, has consented to acquire on behalf of the Samity the piece or parcel of land hereinbefore described.

And whereas, the said Government of East Bengal has required the Samity under the provisions of section 41 of the above mentioned Act to enter into the agreement with Governor hereinafter contained. Now this indenture witnesseth that it is hereby agreed and declared as follows:—

1. On demand the Samity shall and will pay to the said Government of East Bengal all and every compensation in respect of the said land tendered, paid or awarded or to be tendered, paid or awarded by the Collector under the Land Acquisition Act, 1894, or by Court to which a reference under Part III of the said Act may be made or by the Court or Courts to which an appeal from the award of the said Court may be preferred and all costs, charges and expenses, of the proceedings of the aforesaid Courts, or otherwise incidental to the proposed acquisition or payable in respect thereof under the provisions of the said Act.

2. On demand made by the said Collector the obligations of the Samity under the last preceding clause not being thereby limited, the Samity shall and will deposit with the said Collector such sum or sums of money as in his discretion the said Collector may in anticipation estimate to be necessary for the purpose mentioned in the last preceding clause.

3. On payment by the Samity of all demands under the foregoing first clause, or, in the discretion of the said Government of East Bengal (on deposit by the Samity of all estimated amounts as provided in the second clause), but not before possession shall have been taken under the provisions of the abovementioned Act, the Governor shall make over possession of the said land to the Samity and shall execute and do all such acts and deeds as may be necessary and proper for effectually vesting the same in the Samity.

4. The said land shall be held by the Samity for the purpose of construction of a storage as is hereinbefore mentioned and without the sanction in writing of the said Government of East Bengal first had and obtained for no other purpose whatsoever.

5. The said storage shall be completed within 1 (one) year from the date on which possession of the said land shall have been given to the Samity.

6. Should the said storage not be completed within the period stated in the last preceding clause or within such further period as in its discretion may be prescribed or allowed by the said Government of East Bengal or should the said land at any time thereafter cease for a period of 6 (six) consecutive months, to be held and used or ceased to be required for the purpose or purposes provided for in the foregoing fourth clause then and in any such case, the said Government may summarily re-enter upon and take possession of the said land together with all buildings

thereon, whether such buildings were erected before or after transfer of the land to the Samity and thereupon the interest of the Samity in the said land and buildings shall absolutely cease and determine.

7. On taking such possession the said Government may sell or otherwise deal with the said land and buildings as it may think proper.

- (i) Should the said Government sell the land with the buildings the said Government after deducting the expense incurred in connection with the said taking of possession and with such sale shall pay the proceeds to the Samity.
- (ii) Should the said Government decide not to sell the land and buildings the said Government shall retain the said land and buildings thereon in which case the Governor shall repay to the Samity the market value as on the day of re-entry of all the buildings erected by the Samity and all sums received from the Samity in respect of all and every compensation as provided in the foregoing first clause (less the statutory allowance of 15 per cent., and less any amount received on account of trees and buildings which are not in existence at the time of resumption), but will not repay any sums paid and received on account of costs, charges and expenses.
- (iii) Should the said Government decide to sell the buildings only upon such sale, the Governor after deducting the expenses of taking possession and selling, pay the balance of the proceeds of sale to the Samity, together with the sum received from the Samity in respect of compensation for the said land, (less the statutory allowance of 15 percent., and less any amount received from the Samity on account of trees and buildings which are not in existence at the time of resumption), but will not repay any sum paid and received on account of costs, charges and expenses.

8. The public shall be entitled to use the land subject to the laws and rules governing the Co-operative Societies and to the by-laws of the Samity.

9. Should any dispute or difference arise touching or concerning the subject matter of this agreement or any covenant clause or things herein contained the same shall be referred to the said Government of East Bengal and the opinion and decision of the said Government upon such dispute or difference shall be final and conclusive and binding on the parties hereto.

No. 46c/Est/59(c).—17th October 1955.—The following regulations made by the East Pakistan Secondary Education Board under sub-sections (1) and (2) of the section 17 of the East Bengal Secondary Education Act, 1955 (East Bengal Act IV of 1955) and approved by the Provincial Government, is published hereby in pursuance of sub-section (4) of section 17 of that Act:—

*Regulations under clause (a) of sub-section (2) of section 17 of the East Bengal Secondary Education Act, 1955 (East Bengal Act IV of 1955) (hereinafter referred to as the Act) to provide for the powers and duties of the Executive Council.*

1. Under the general direction and control of the Board and in accordance with the policy laid down by it, the Executive Council shall take all such actions as are necessary to carry out the purposes of the Act, and in particular:—

- (a) prescribe courses of instruction for all classes of the secondary schools;
- (b) grant, withhold or withdraw recognition to and from secondary schools after considering the recommendations of the Recognition Committee;
- (c) prescribe the conditions governing admission of students to and transfer of students to and from secondary schools;
- (d) prescribe the manner and mode of inspection of secondary schools and to cause inspection of such schools by an officer of the Board;
- (e) hold, conduct and regulate examinations at the end of secondary school course or at any other stage thereof;
- (f) publish the results of examinations held by the Board, after considering the recommendations of the Examinations Committee;
- (g) grant certificates to persons who have passed examinations held by the Board and may grant scholarships to such of them as may be deemed deserving;
- (h) arbitrate or arrange for arbitration in disputes between teachers and Managing Committees of secondary schools; and
- (i) enforce discipline and take such disciplinary action as may be deemed necessary after considering the recommendations of the relevant committee or committees against any secondary school, teacher or student thereof for breach of any rules or regulations and/or for adopting unfairmeans so far as conduct, study and examinations are concerned.

2. All actions taken by the Executive Council under the above regulation shall be reported to the Board which shall have power to review and comment on such action for future guidance of the Executive Council :

Provided that if the Board decide to reverse any action of the Executive Council such decision shall not invalidate any action already taken towards the implementation of the decision of the Executive Council nor would any officer of the Board be held responsible for such past action. The Board's decision will determine the future course of action on the point.

3. The Executive Council shall consider the recommendations of all committees formed under the Act and regulations thereunder and take decision thereon provided that such decision is not contrary to any decision of the Board.

4. The Executive Council shall have power to consider and dispose of the cases of members of the committees who cease to be members thereof for failure to attend three consecutive meetings of a committee under regulation 16 (General: for committees) of the Regulations under sub-section (2) of section 20 of the Act.

5. The Executive Council shall have powers to acquire, hold, transfer and administer movable or immovable properties and to accept donations or endowments for specific purposes for and on behalf of the Board.

*Regulations under clause (b) of sub-section (2) of section 17 of the East Bengal Secondary Education Act, 1955 (East Bengal Act IV of 1955) (hereinafter referred to as the Act) regarding the powers and duties of the officers of the Board other than the President.*

1. Powers and duties of the Secretary.—The Secretary of the Board shall discharge the executive functions of the Board, conduct all its official correspondence and maintain all records, documents and registers of the Board under the authority of the President.

2. In consultation with the President he shall arrange for the meetings of the Board, the Executive Council and other committees and sub-committees and shall issue notices and other connected papers.

3. He shall attend all meetings of the Board, the Executive Council and all other committees and sub-committees.

4. He shall prepare draft proceedings of all such meetings and get them approved by the President after which he shall circulate the same to all concerned.

5. He shall be the custodian of the library, furniture, equipment and other properties of the Board.

6. He shall publish such publications as may be required.
7. He shall be the drawing and disbursing officer for the employees of the Board other than the officers. He shall be responsible for proper deduction and recoveries and see that such amounts are credited to the appropriate authorities or funds.
8. He shall be the custodian of the imprest cash of the Board and shall incur normal expenditure not exceeding Rs.250 for each item at a time. For any unusual expenditure and any normal expenditure exceeding Rs.250 prior approval of the President shall have to be obtained by him before it is incurred.
9. Subject to the conditions laid down in regulation No. 8 above the Secretary shall draw and disburse all contingent bills.
10. He shall be the controlling officer for the purpose of travelling allowance in respect of classes III and IV (as classified by the Executive Council for the purpose of travelling allowance) employees of the Board.
11. He shall perform such other duties as may be assigned to him by the President.
12. With the prior approval of the President he may allocate some of his duties and functions allotted to him to any officer or employee of the Board.
13. **Powers and duties of the Controller of Examinations.**—Under the authority of the President the Controller of Examinations shall be responsible for the holding of the Examinations of the Board and for making all necessary arrangement for the same.
14. He shall receive and deal with the applications for admission to the examinations of the Board and carry on all correspondence connected with such examinations and issue necessary documents as admissible under the rules and regulations.
15. He shall be responsible for getting the question papers timely set, translated where necessary, moderated and printed and their safe custody and secrecy of the contents at all stages.
16. He shall be responsible for:—
  - (a) proper distribution of question papers and examination materials to all examination centres in time,
  - (b) collection of all answer scripts, surplus examination materials and reports and other documents from all centres,
  - (c) holding of the examiners' meetings, distribution of answer scripts to them and collection of the marked answer scripts together with mark-sheets from all examiners,
  - (d) distribution of the marked answer scripts to the Head Examiners, collection of marks from them and distribution of marks to the respective tabulators,
  - (e) collection of tabulated results from the tabulators,
  - (f) publication of results of the examinations,
  - (g) issue of certificates to the successful candidates in time.
17. He shall be responsible for ensuring and maintaining strict secrecy of all information regarding the examinations of the Board.
18. It shall be the duty of the Controller of Examinations to make recommendations to the President on the following matters:—
  - (a) appointment of paper setters, translators, moderators, Head Examiners, Assistant Head Examiners, Examiners, scrutinisers and tabulators,
  - (b) selection of centres of examinations including opening of new and closing of old centres of examinations where necessary,
  - (c) such other matters as he may deem necessary and as may be required of him by the President.
19. He shall prepare all bills of remuneration for work in connection with the examinations of the Board and submit the same to the Secretary of the Board for payment:  
Provided that bills for remuneration to examiners and scrutinisers are to be prepared on the basis of reports from the Head Examiners concerned.
20. The Controller of Examinations shall bring to the notice of the President all cases of infringement of rules of examinations with full report for disposal.
21. The Controller shall attend all meetings in which matters relating to Examinations of the Board are included in the agenda.

*Regulations under clause (n) of sub-section (2) of section 17 of the East Bengal Secondary Education Act, 1955 (East Bengal Act IV of 1955) (hereinafter referred to as the Act) to provide for the manner of election of the members of the Executive Council specified in clauses (f), (g), (h) and (j) of sub-section (1) of section 18 of the Act.*

1. The election will be held at a meeting of the Board with this item on the agenda.
2. The President of the Board shall preside over the election.

3. All the members of the Board shall have the right to vote, but a member can only exercise his vote if he is personally present at the meeting.

4. Each voter shall have as many votes as there are vacancies but he cannot exercise more than one vote in favour of a candidate.

5. In case of equality of votes, the Presiding Officer shall have a casting vote.

6. The list of members eligible for election to the Executive Council under each category shall be prepared by the Secretary of the Board.

7. The date, time and place of election will be notified by the Secretary of the Board in consultation with the President.

8. The notice of the meeting shall be issued by the Secretary of the Board to the members at least 10 days before the meeting by post.

9. The Presiding Officer shall decide on the spot whether the voting shall be by show of hands or by ballot.

10. The Presiding Officer shall ask for nominations under each category. Any member of the Board can nominate as many members as there are vacancies in a particular category from which the latter is to be elected.

11. Every nomination must be seconded; otherwise it shall fall through.

12. When there are no further nominations, the Presiding Officer shall declare the nominations closed. He shall then cause the names of persons nominated under each category to be read out.

13. In case the number of person or persons nominated in a category, is equal to number of vacancy or vacancies, the Presiding Officer shall declare the person or persons so nominated as elected.

14. If the number of person or persons nominated in a category exceeds the number of vacancy or vacancies in that category, the Presiding Officer shall take votes as per Regulation 9.

15. The Presiding Officer shall count the votes and declare the results in the meeting. He may appoint one or more tellers to assist him in counting the votes.

16. The decision of the Presiding Officer in all matters relating to the election shall be final.

17. The decision of the President regarding any matter not covered by the above regulations shall be final.




