NATIONAL FOREST POLICY

INTRODUCTION

No. F. 14-7/54-F.—The Government of Pakistan has so far been following the old Forest Policy of the undivided Government of India enunciated in their Department of Revenue and Agriculture Resolution No. 22-F, dated 19th October, 1894, for the management of State forests in the country. Pakistan has only about 4 per cent of its land under State forests against 22 per cent in undivided India. This small area of forests is altogether insufficient to meet the requirements of fuel and timber in the country. A dynamic Forest Policy is, therefore, required for Pakistan to be vigorously pursued to increase the area of forest by large

scale afforestation and by introduction of scientific forestry in private forests. Over the greater part of West Pakistan grazing is of paramount importance in the economic life of its population and this subject, therefore, requires a prominent place in the general forest policy of the country. Forests are necessary for development of industries and communications and soil erosion and in conserving water. Forests are also essentially necessary for the preservation of wild life.

2. The Government of Pakistan have, therefore, decided to reorientate the Forest Policy on the lines indicated below:

3. *General.*—Whereas it is essential to preserve in perpetuity, for the benefit of the people of Pakistan sufficient land under forests to maintain and develop the supply of fuel and fodder to produce an adequate yield of timber and other forest products, to conserve soil, to maintain essential services and industrial enterprise and to improve conditions for preservation of wild life, a high priority should be given in the national development plans to the claims of forestry and adequate forestry programmes.

4. *Private forests.*—The area of State forests is so small in Pakistan that it is thought necessary to preserve the forests wherever they occur whether on Government or on private land. Forestry is, however, a long term process and the private owners have neither the means nor the knowledge necessary to manage the forests scientifically. It is only on the basis of sustained yield management that forests can be perpetuated.—The practice of sound management in privately owned forests should be ensured by legislation or otherwise and such technical and financial assistance provided by Government as may be deemed necessary.

5. *Soil Conservation.*—Soil erosion has gone on for centuries in the uplands of West Pakistan. Over large areas the country presents a barren look and particularly in the vicinity of Salt Range salination has already rendered large areas at the foot of these hills unfit for cultivation. In all cases where as a result of defective methods of cultivation deterioration of soil has taken place or is likely to take place necessary powers should be obtained to control land use under a co-ordinated programme of soil conservation and land utilization.

6. *Public support.*—The devastation of forests both by faulty agricultural methods and unregulated grazing has gone on to such a large extent that the conservation of forests is only possible by mobilization of public opinion in its support. Public support should be enlisted for the execution of forest policy through education, propaganda and demonstration.

7. *Classification.*—Even the small area of State forests in Pakistan does not yield timber and fuel through out. Large tracts are more forest lands than forests. Some forests are more necessary for preservation of soil and water than for production of timber and fuel. Forests should be classified on the basis of their utility and objects.

8. *Commercial aspect.*—Great importance has been attached in the past to the commercial aspect of forestry as forests cater principally to the requirements of the individuals. The beneficial aspect of forestry should now get precedence over the commercial aspect. It is only then that love of forestry can be created in the minds of the people without which maintenance of forests becomes extremely difficult. The commercial aspect of forestry should be as far as possible subordinated the over-riding requirement of an integrated economic policy devised for the country as a whole.

9. *Forestry on reclaimed land.*—The extent of forests in West Pakistan is extremely poor and will not extend to more than 3 per cent of the land area. The growing

of trees in this part of Pakistan is limited by the availability of water. While agriculture is being encouraged by harnessing the water resources, forests can be raised with canal irrigation. Afforestation is possible on the canal banks, road and railway if water can be made available to the plant. make the people tree minded small plantations have to be insisted on in all new colonies. It is by such concerted efforts that the total area of forest particularly in West Pakistan can be increased. Realising the deficiency of forest area in the country and a properly planned programme should be undertaken for increasing forest area by methods suited to local conditions. For example in Pakistan the objective can be achieved by (a) increasing at least 10 per cent of canal irrigated land to per cent water supply for raising irrigated forests in the new tracts, (b) growing trees along canal, road and railway tracts and on arable waste land, (c) encouraging farm forestry, on co-operation by village communities in compact blocks of forest set apart for the purpose.

10. *Utilization.*—By far the larger area of forest in Pakistan lies in the province of East Bengal, one of the most thickly populated parts of the country. The forests there are situated in inaccessible areas where cultivation is difficult. Big trees occur in forests and they cannot be extracted and brought to the market for lack of equipment and transport facilities. In order to make full use of the available timber in the country intensive utilization of forests in those forests is necessary.—Existing forests should be developed by encouraging the most efficient utilization of timber and other forest products.

11. *Working plans.*—The sure method of preserving forests is to work them on a sustained yield under a regular Working Plan. Such Working Plans ensure that the forest area carries a normal yield which will yield a definite amount of produce for consumption every year. Whenever a forest area is cut it will be regenerated with species of trees of equal value if not of greater value. All forests should be managed under an approved Working Plan.

12. *Forest Service.*—Forestry is a complicated process and a long term project. Highly trained personnel are, therefore, necessary to manage forests scientifically over a long period of years. Every other rotation extends to 100—150 years. Even for production of firewood the rotation is 20—30 years. A properly constituted forest service of fully trained personnel should be made responsible for the execution of forest policy.

13. *Research and Education.*—In dealing with a crop whose life often extends beyond a century extensive research is necessary not only to find the most efficient method of utilization but also for protection and improved yield of the crop over long periods. For research and education which are the prerequisites of an effective forest policy should be organized suitable lines.

14. *Fauna.*—Forests are the only areas where land fauna of the country can be maintained. Pakistan is rich in wild life. Whether it is the elephants and tigers of East Bengal or wild goats and chinkaras of West Pakistan the over of a forest is essential for their existence. It is in fact the ruthless destruction of forests in the past that the number of wild animals is steadily going down. Adequate protection and living space must be provided to the animals to prevent their total extinction and measures taken for the preservation of wild life which serves human beings in more ways than one.

15. ORDERED that copies of the Resolution be forwarded to the Provincial Governments and all Ministries of the Government of Pakistan.

16. ORDERED also that the Resolution be published in the *Gazette of Pakistan*, for general information.

No. I-II-3(18)/55.—The following rules for recruitment to the Printing and Stationery Accounts service under the Printing and Stationery Department, Ministry of Industries are published for general information.

PART I.—METHOD OF RECRUITMENT

These rules may be called the Printing and Stationery Accounts Service Recruitment Rules.

2. For the purpose of these Rules:—

- (i) "Controller" means the Controller of Printing and Stationery, Government of Pakistan, Karachi.
- (ii) "Direct appointment" means appointment made otherwise than by promotion or transfer from another service/Department.
- (iii) "Service" means the Stationery and Printing Department Accounts Service.
- (iv) "Department" means the Stationery and Printing Department.

3. Recruitment to the Service shall be made by holding Departmental Examination in accordance with Part II of these rules.

4. Appointments to the Service shall be made by the Controller.

5. These rules shall apply to all the Government of Pakistan Presses including the Cypher Printing Press, Karachi, Stationery and Forms Offices, Karachi and Dacca, and the Central Publication Branch Karachi.

PART II.—RECRUITMENT BY DEPARTMENTAL EXAMINATION

6. The examination will be held as and when considered necessary by the Controller having regard to the existing or expected vacancies and other factors. The Presses and Branches will be informed of the decision to hold the examination sufficiently in advance to enable the eligible candidates to apply in time for admission to the examination.

7. Admission to the examination shall be open only to the staff of the department (including that of Headquarters office) and shall be subject to the following conditions:—

- (i) A candidate must be a permanent employee borne on the clerical cadre and must have completed at least 7 years Government Service on the last date prescribed for the submission of applications for admission to the examination.
- (ii) The candidate must have earned a satisfactory report as regards conduct and work and should have preferably proved aptitude for accounts work. The candidates will be selected by the Departmental Promotion Committee of the respective offices (who will consider the suitability of the candidates) subject to the approval of the Controller who will decide finally as to whether a candidate should be admitted to the examination or not.
- (iii) A candidate who fails to qualify in two successive examinations will not be eligible to appear at any subsequent examination.

8. The examination will generally be held simultaneously at Karachi and Dacca under arrangement made by the Accountant General, Pakistan Revenues, Karachi but any other centre or centres may also be fixed by the Controller, if necessary.

9. The time spent to attend the examination including the time required for journey, if any, shall be treated as duty but no travelling allowance shall be admissible.

10. The candidates will normally be given six months notice for preparation but the period may be reduced if the circumstances in any case so warrant.

11. When the results of an examination are available a list of successful candidates arranged in order of merit will be circulated to the offices subordinate to the Department (including Headquarters Office).

12. Appointments to permanent vacancies as well as temporary vacancies of more than three months duration will be made according to the position obtained in the examination, i.e., the candidates securing highest position in the examination will be appointed, irrespective of where the vacancy exists, provided that any qualified candidate borne on the establishment of the Headquarters office will not be considered for appointment to vacancies in the above manner if a qualified candidate from an office subordinate to the Department is available. Temporary vacancies of three months duration or less may be filled in such manner as is considered by the Controller to be conducive to the administrative convenience and consistency.

ent with the requirement of each case. As a rule, however, a vacancy of Accountant will be filled by an unqualified man so long as a qualified man is not available.

13. (a) Appointments shall be made on probation for a period of six months.

(b) If, in the opinion of Controller, the work or conduct of a probationer is unsatisfactory or shows that he is unlikely to become efficient, the Controller may revert him to his original post.

(c) On the conclusion of the period of probation in his appointment, or if his work and conduct has in the opinion of the Controller been unsatisfactory, the Controller may either revert him to his original post or extend his period of probation for such further period, not exceeding one year, as the Controller may think fit.

(d) If no action is taken by the Controller under sub-rule (b) or (c) of this rule, the period after the prescribed period of probation shall be treated as an engagement until further orders.

14. (a) Candidates who fail in the examination as a whole but pass in any subject with at least 60% marks (Separately in each paper where there is more than one paper in any subject) will be exempted from appearing again in that subject at a later examination.

(b) Accountants Officiating before the enforcement of these rules may be exempted by the Government on the recommendation of the Controller from appearing in the examination on merit of each individual, case.

15. The Controller may relax in suitable cases one or more of the conditions laid down in Rule 7 in favour of a deserving candidate for reasons to be recorded in writing. He may also relax with the approval of the Government of Pakistan, any other provision of these rules in special case, where this is considered necessary in the public interest.

(iii) General Financial Rules, Volume I—Chapters 1—8, Chapter 13, Chapter 14, Part I, III and VI, Chapter 15.

(iv) General Financial Rules, Volume II—Appendix 1, Part XV and Appendices 2, 4, and 7 to 10.

(v) Book of Financial Powers. One paper theoretical and one paper practical.

5. (i) Hand Book of the Government of Presses Chapters 2-4, 8 and 9 relating to section and all appendices.

(ii) Workman's Compensation Act and the thereunder—

one paper theoretical,

one paper practical.

NOTE.—The syllabus outlined above is subject to alterations as and when necessary.

II. For practical papers referred to in rules the time prescribed shall be 2 hours and the candidates shall be permitted to bring into the Examination the Books prescribed for such subject and use them for answering the questions. For theoretical papers, the time shall be 2 hours. The number of marks shall be 100 for each paper.

BYE-LAWS FOR THE REGISTRATION OF BIRTHS AND DEATHS AND THE TAKING OF A CENSUS IN DACCA CANTONMENT.

1. All Births and deaths which take place within the limits of the Dacca Cantonment and are reported in compliance with these bye-laws shall be registered at the Office of the Cantonment Board, Dacca.

2. The Executive Officer shall maintain or cause to be maintained, by such official as may be appointed by him for the purpose, two separate registers for the registration of births and deaths respectively.

3. The following particulars regarding every birth (which term shall include the birth of a still-born child) shall be reported and entered in the register of births:—

- the date of the report;
- the date of the birth;
- the name of the child (if any);
- the sex of the child;
- the name of the father;
- the caste or religion of the father;
- the place of residence of the father;
- the occupation or profession of the father;
- the name of the person making the report;
- the name of the midwife, if any, who attended the mother at the time of delivery.

Provided that in the case of an illegitimate child, a note to that effect shall be made in the register if the name of the father of such child is not known or is in dispute, the name, caste or religion and place of residence of the mother shall be entered instead of such particulars of the father.

4. The following particulars regarding every death shall be reported and entered in the register of deaths:—

- the date of the report;
- the date of the death;
- the name of the deceased;
- the name of the father, or, if the deceased was a married woman, of the husband at the time of the death;
- the sex of the deceased;
- the age of the deceased;
- the caste or religion of the deceased;
- the place of residence of the deceased;
- the occupation or profession of the deceased;
- the cause of the death (disease, injury, etc.);
- the name and address of the person making the report.

5. Any person reporting a birth shall attest the entry by his signature or thumb mark in the register.

6. The head of the family or the manager of the time being of every household in which any birth or death occurs shall, within forty eight hours after the event, report the same to the Executive Officer together with the particulars prescribed in bye-law 4, as the case may be.

7. Every Military or Civil Medical Officer of Government and every private medical practitioner shall report to the Executive Officer, within forty eight hours after the event, the occurrence of every birth or death within the Cantonment of which he may be cognisant in the exercise of his profession.



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8. The Officer in charge of every dispensary, hospital, jail or other similar institution situated within Cantonment limits, shall report to the Executive Officer, within forty eight hours after the event, the occurrence of birth or death within the institution of which he is incharge.

9. The head or manager or the person in charge of every club-hotel, orphanage, boarding house takia, mosque, bungalow dharamasala, temple, Serai or any other such establishment situated within Cantonment limit shall report to the Executive Officer within forty eight hours after the event the occurrence of every birth or death in any of the aforesaid places under his control.

10. If a dead body is found exposed or in suspicious circumstances within Cantonment limits the officer-in-charge of the police station within whose jurisdiction such body is found shall report the fact to the Executive Officer within forty eight hours of his becoming aware of it, and shall send a written statement of the circumstances in which death would appear to have ensued, together with a certificate of a Medical Officer explanatory of the cause of death.

11. On receipt of any such report as is mentioned in the foregoing bye-laws the Executive Officer shall either himself, or through any person authorised by him in this behalf, register free of charge the birth or death in the appropriate register maintained for the purpose.

12. Any person may inspect a register of births or deaths on payment of a fee of one rupee.

13. Any person applying for a certified copy of an entry in the births and deaths register shall be furnished with such copy, signed by the Executive Officer and sealed with the seal of the Cantonment Board, on payment of such fee as may be prescribed by the Cantonment Board, in this behalf.

14. No person shall wilfully destroy, alter or mutilate or cause to be destroyed, altered or mutilated any register of births and deaths or shall wilfully insert or cause to be inserted, in any such register or certified copy thereof any false entry with regard to any birth or death and no person entrusted with the maintenance of any such register shall, without reasonable cause, refuse or omit to enter in the appropriate register any birth or death reported to him.

15. (1) Any clerical error which may at any time be discovered in any register of birth's or deaths may be corrected by the Executive Officer.

(2) An error of fact or substance in any register of births or deaths may be corrected by the Executive Officer, by an entry in the margin without any alteration of the original entry, upon production by the person requiring such correction of a declaration on oath or solemn affirmation setting forth the nature of the error and the true fact.....of the made before a magistrate of the 1st class

17. Whenever any census is undertaken by the Cantonment Board or by Government the occupier of every building, or any part thereof, within Cantonment limits, shall supply, on demand to any officer or servant of the Cantonment Board, to the best of knowledge and ability, any information that may be required with regard to himself and all other occupants of the building.

18. PENALTY:—Any person committing a contravention of any of these bye-laws shall, on conviction,

be punishable with fine which may extend to one hundred rupees and, in the case of continuing contravention, with an additional fine which may extend to twenty rupees for every day during which such contravention continues after conviction for the first such contravention.

REMARKS

During the week ending the 8th October, 1955, in 11 towns of Pakistan (excluding Sind, East Bengal, Karachi and 12 towns of the Punjab Province) having a population of 30,000 and over, the total number of deaths recorded was 19. The 1951-Census population of these towns was 1,412,840 and the death rate per thousand was 8.5. The births in same towns numbered 1,034 giving a birth rate of 38.0 per thousand of population.

Small-pox, cholera and Plague remained absent during the week under report.
