REMARKS

During the week ending the 31st March, 1956, in 18 towns of Pakistan (excluding 27 towns of West Pakistan having a population of 30,000 and over, the total number of deaths recorded was 549. The 1951 Census population of the towns was 27,59,871 and the death rate per thousand was 10.3. The births in the same towns numbered 1,568 giving birth rate of 29.5 per thousand of population.

In the above-mentioned towns of Pakistan there were 24 deaths from Small-pox and 9 deaths from Cholera. The deaths from Small-pox were recorded in Dacca 18 and Mymensingh 6. The deaths from Cholera were recorded Chittagong 7 and Dacca 2.

Plague remained absent during the week under report.
