Suleman Shah, No. 220 for the distribution of ammunition to the Border Policemen extending over an area of 800 yards. Having distributed the bulk of the ammunition, Foot Constable, Mazal Khan was killed along with A. S.-I. Suleman Shah and Foot Constable, Badshah, No. 5264 at the extreme of the area in an effort to carry ammunition to the remaining men of the Border Police.

Foot Constable, Mazal Khan set a high example of devotion to duty and courage in this encounter.

This posthumous award is made for gallantry under the Regulations governing the grant of the Pakistan Police Medal and consequently carries with it the special allowance admissible to officers of and below the rank of Inspector of Police.

Constable, Sikandar Khan, No. 2920, Karachi Police.

On the night of 10th November 1954, Unarmed Police Constable, No. 2920, Sikandar Khan was on night patrol duty when he heard shouts for help from a deserted spot on the sea shore and running to the spot he found two persons criminally assaulting a boy. When he went to rescue the boy he received 11 serious stab wounds, some of which punctured his lungs and liver. He still clung on to his assailants and shouted for help. On hearing his cries Unarmed Head Constable, No. 1354, Muhammad Bashir arrived and, despite a ferocious onslaught by the assailants succeeded in arresting one of them, whilst the other disappeared in the darkness and was rounded up subsequently.

The Constable did not show any regard for his personal safety and displayed courage of a very high order.

II. Mr. Abdul Majid Choudhry, Assistant Sub-Inspector of Police, Bakarganj, East Pakistan.	On receipt of information on 4th November 1953 that 10/12 dacoits, armed with guns, after committing a dacoity in a house in the village Bakerchar, police-station Babuganj, district Bakarganj, were retreating towards Sikarpur, A. S.-I. Abdul Majid along with two constables with muskets immediately went after them. At about midnight he arrived near the village, and noticed flashes of an electric torch some distance away. Suspecting the presence of the dacoits he got down from his boat with the constables and proceeded on foot. When he came near, the dacoits opened fire. The A. S.-I. along with his constables took cover, but did not return fire in the darkness as there was a danger of missing the dacoits, and hitting the villagers who were approaching. Three of the villagers were wounded by the dacoits' gun fire. The A. S.-I. with his constable and some villagers, manoeuvred and cut off the dacoits' line of retreat. He then led the constables, and jumping into the dacoits' boat, captured three of the dacoits, the rest escaping by jumping into the river. A sum of Rs.5,140, 88 items of valuable property of other dacoities and deadly weapons such as ramdaos, were seized. The confessions of the

captured dacoits and investigation by the C.I. led to the breaking up of a dangerous gang of dacoits and the conviction of 8 dacoits who were sentenced to five years' R. I. each.

The A. S.-I. displayed conspicuous courage and tenacity in capturing dangerous dacoits at risk of his life.

This award is made for gallantry under the Regulations governing the grant of the Pakistan Police Medal and consequently carries with the special allowance admissible to officers of and below the rank of Inspector of Police.

2. Foot Constable, Muhammad Fazil, No. 1079 of Platoon No. 210, Border Police, West Pakistan.

On the 18th March 1956, a serious clash took place between some personnel of the Pakistan Border Police and a party of the armed raiders. Foot Constable, Muhammad Fazil was one of the lead men on the advance towards raiders and on being challenged by the raiders he refused to stop. During the ensuing battle he was hit by a hand grenade when he was face to face with the armed raiders and died in an effort to complete the task assigned to him.

Foot Constable, Muhammad Fazil showed a complete disregard for his personal safety and set a high example of devotion to duty and courage in this encounter.

This posthumous award is made for gallantry under the Regulations governing the grant of the Pakistan Police Medal and consequently carries with the special allowance admissible to officers of and below the rank of Inspector of Police.

3. Mr. Nur Muhammad Khan, Deputy Superintendent of Police, Border Police, West Pakistan.

On the 18th March 1956, a serious clash took place between some personnel of the Pakistan Border Police and a party of the armed raiders. D. S. Nur Muhammad Khan was in command of platoons of the Border Police which were detailed to stop raiders. On undertaking the task detailed to him, D. S. P. Nur Muhammad Khan assigned his bren-gun fire to armed persons in positions and silenced two of them.

He remained with his men throughout the action and set a high example of personal courage and devotion to duty.

The award is made for gallantry under the Regulations governing the grant of the Pakistan Police Medal.

4. Foot Constable, Khan Badshah, No. 5264 of Platoon No. 16, Border Police, West Pakistan.

On the 18th March 1956, a serious clash took place between some personnel of the Pakistan Border Police and a party of the armed raiders. This Foot Constable was one of the lead men of the foot constables who had been detailed to accompany A. S.-I. Suleman Shah, No. 220 to act as a party for

Failure to produce these statements will render the applicant ineligible. Production of these statements is waived in respect of candidates, already in the employ of Government. They should, however, produce certificate of good conduct from the heads of their departments.

4. Fee.—Candidates must enclose with their applications a fee of Rs. 5 in the form of a receipted chalan from a Government Treasury in Pakistan or from the State Bank of Pakistan under the head "XXXVI—Miscellaneous Department—Professional (East Pakistan)—Miscellaneous Examination fee for the post in question". Money orders, cheques, etc., in lieu of chalans are not accepted. In no circumstances will this fee be refunded.

5. Address.—Candidates should give their present address and should communicate at once any subsequent change of address.

6. Canvassing.—Any attempt on the part of candidates to enlist support for their applications through persons of influence or officials of Government will disqualify them from appointment. Spontaneous recommendations from persons interested in the candidates or otherwise known to them will be disregarded.

7. General.—Before the issue of an interview card the Commission can give no information indicating whether or not the candidates will be found eligible in respect of age and academic qualifications. Prospective candidates are therefore advised not to write for information but to submit their application form in accordance with the advertisement and await the decision of the Commission on the applications they have submitted.

The Commission will only acknowledge the receipt of a application or reply to an enquiry about an application if a stamped envelope accompanies the enquiry or request for acknowledgment. The Commission are unable to give any indication of what has been their recommendation to Government in respect of an application received by them.

Applications from candidates who are in permanent or temporary employment under any Government in Pakistan will be rejected unless they are submitted through the appointing authority of their posts or services.

Candidates called for interview will appear at their own expenses.

And Whereas the Government of East Pakistan being satisfied by an enquiry held under sections 5A and 40 of the said Act that the proposed acquisition is needed for the aforesaid purpose and that the said work is likely to prove useful to the public has consented to acquire on behalf of the Company the pieces or parcels of land hereinbefore described.

Now this Indenture witnesseth that it is hereby agreed and declared as follows:

1. On demand made by the said Collector, the obligations of the Company under the last preceding clause not being thereby limited, the Company shall and will deposit with the said Collector such sum or sums of money as in his discretion the said Collector may in anticipation estimate to be necessary for the purposes mentioned in the last preceding clause.

3. On payment by the Company of all demands under the foregoing first clause or in the discretion of the said Government of East Pakistan on deposit by the Company of all estimated amounts provided in the second clause, but not before possession shall have been taken under the provision of the abovementioned Act, the Governor shall make over possession of the said land to the Company and shall execute and do all such acts and deeds as may be necessary and proper for finally vesting the same in the Company.

4. The said land shall be held by the Company for the purpose of such dwelling houses for operators and coolies, library, play ground, water works, dumping stations and necessary arrangements for the workers of the Company as is hereinbefore mentioned and without the sanction in writing of the said Government of East Pakistan first had and obtained, for no other purpose whatsoever.

5. The said dwelling houses for operators and coolies, library, play ground, water works, dumping station and necessary arrangements for the workers of the Company will be completed and fully equipped in all respects ready for use within three years from the date on which possession of the said land shall have been given to the Company.

6. Should the said dwelling houses for operators and coolies, library, play ground, water works, dumping station and necessary arrangement for the workers of the Company not be completed and fully equipped in all respects ready for use within the period stated in the last preceding clause or within such further periods as in its discretion may be prescribed or allowed by the said Government of East Pakistan or should the said land at any

time thereafter cease for a period of six consecutive months to be held and used or cease to be required for the purpose or purposes provided for in the foregoing fourth clause then and in any such case the said Government of East Pakistan may summarily re-enter upon and take possession of the said land together with the buildings thereon, whether such buildings were erected before or after transfer of the land to the Company, and thereupon the interest of the Company in the said land and buildings shall absolutely cease and determine.

7. On taking such possession the said Government may sell or otherwise deal with the said land and buildings as it may think proper.

(i) Should the said Government sell the said land with the buildings the said Government after deducting the expenses incurred in connection with said taking of possession and with such sale shall pay the proceeds to the Company.

(ii) Should the said Government decide not to sell the land and buildings the said Government shall retain the said land and buildings thereon in which case the Governor shall repay to the Company the market value as on the day of re-entry of all the buildings erected by the Company and all sums received from the Company in respect of all and every compensation as provided in the foregoing first clause (less the statutory allowance of 15 per cent. and less any amount received on account of trees and buildings which are not in existence at the time of resumption) but will not repay any sums paid and received on account of costs, charges and expenses.

(iii) Should the said Government decide to sell the buildings only, upon such sale the Governor after deducting the expenses of taking possession and selling shall pay the balance of the proceeds of sale to the Company together with the sum received from the Company in respect of the compensation for the land (less the statutory allowance of 15 per cent. and less any amount received from the Company on account of trees and buildings which are not in existence at the time of resumption) but will not repay any sum paid and received on account of costs, charges and expenses.

8. The public shall be entitled to the use of the said library, play ground and water works, subject to their observance of the rules and regulations framed by the Company with Government approval thereto for the use of these properties.

8. (a) The Company shall give training in various processes carried on in the Company's mills, to not less than four apprentices a year, selection of such apprentices being made annually from the number of candidates nominated by such officer as may be nominated by Government in the Commerce, Labour and Industries (Industries) Department for the purpose. The Company shall not charge any fees or premium of any kind for such training.

(b) Change of site of the play ground will be permissible subject to the approval of the alternative site by the local Subdivisional Officer or Government.

9. Should any dispute or difference arise touching or concerning the subject matter of this agreement or any covenant clause or thing herein contained the same shall be referred to the said Government of East Pakistan and the opinion and decision of the said Government upon such dispute or difference shall be final and conclusive and binding on the parties thereto.
