I—General

Decisions in meetings—Every matter required by any provision of the Municipal Administration Ordinance, 1960 (hereinafter referred to as the Ordinance) or any rule or bye-law made thereunder, to be decided by a Municipal Committee shall, unless the context otherwise warrants, be so decided at a meeting of the Municipal Committee to be held in accordance with these regulations. Meetings shall be either ordinary or special.

II—Time, place, notice and quorum of meetings

2. *Place of meeting*—Meetings shall be held at the office of the Municipal Committee or with the permission of the Controlling Authority, at such other place as the Chairman may from time to time determine.

3. *Ordinary meetings and Notice and Agenda thereof*—Ordinary meetings of the Municipal Committee shall be held at least once a month on a day to be fixed* by the members of the committee at a special meeting called for the purpose:

Provided that if for any reason it is deemed inconvenient, the Chairman may fix another day for an ordinary meeting:

Provided further that no separate formal notice of an ordinary meeting need be given to the members except that a copy of the agenda shall be hung on the notice board in the office of the Municipal Committee at least three days before such meeting.

4. *Special Meeting*—(a) A special meeting of the Municipal Committee may be called by the Chairman either on his own motion or on requisition signed by not less than one-third of the total number of members.

Notice of special meeting—(b) When a special meeting of the Municipal Committee is called by the Chairman on his own motion, it will be necessary to give a minimum notice of three days:

Provided that the annual budget estimate shall be circulated to all the members of the Committee at least 14 days before the day fixed for its consideration.

(c) When a special meeting is called on requisition as provided in regulation 4(a), a minimum of seven days' clear notice shall be given to every member along with a copy of the agenda.

5. *Validity of decisions*—No decision of a Municipal Committee shall be invalid merely on the ground that a notice of the meeting in which the decision was taken had not been served upon or received by any member provided that the meeting so convened had a quorum.

6. *Agenda*—Every notice shall set forth clearly the business to be transacted at the meeting.

7. *Postponement of meeting*—When notice of a meeting has been issued to the members it shall not be called or postponed unless at least three clear days' notice of such cancellation or postponement is given to the members:

Provided that in no case shall a meeting of which due notice has been given be cancelled or postponed, if by such cancellation or postponement the business on the agenda cannot be transacted within a definite period prescribed by any law or rules framed thereunder, for the purpose.

8. *Quorum of meeting*—(1) For both ordinary and special meetings the quorum shall form of one-half of the total number of members:

Provided that in case where the total is an odd number the one-half shall be ascertained by dividing the number next above it by two.

(2) If at the time appointed for a meeting or within half hour thereafter, a quorum is not present the meeting may be adjourned and shall be called again on a future day to be appointed by the Chairman. The members present at such adjourned meeting shall form a quorum, whatever their number may be.

III—Conduct of business

9. *Chairman of meeting*—All meetings of the Municipal Committee shall be presided over by its Chairman, and in his absence by the Vice-Chairman. In the absence of both the Chairman and the Vice-Chairman, the members present shall choose one from among themselves to be the Chairman of the meeting.

* (e.g. First Monday, Last Saturday, etc.)

10. *Register of members*—Before the business of the meeting starts the members present shall sign their names in a register to be maintained for the purpose.

11. *Minute Book*—Minutes of all meetings shall be entered in a book to be kept for the purpose. All decisions of the Committee shall be recorded in it.

A copy of the minutes shall be affixed to the notice board of the Committee where it is accessible to the public.

12. *Business of ordinary meeting*—The business of a Municipal Committee at an ordinary meeting shall be conducted in the following order—

(a) The proceedings of the last ordinary meeting and of any special meeting held thereafter, shall be read out and if approved as correctly entered shall be signed by the Chairman of such meeting. If any errors are pointed out they shall be corrected.

(b) The rest of the agenda.

13. *Business of special meeting*—At a special meeting the business for which the meeting was called shall be considered.

14. *Questions*—After the business on the agenda has been considered or with the permission of the Chairman of the meeting at any other stage, a member may ask questions relating to the affairs of the committee concerned. The Chairman may either himself give a reply or require any other member to do so.

15. *Proposal and amendments*—Every proposal or amendment duly moved shall be seconded and until seconded, no discussion thereon may take place. Every proposal or amendment duly made and seconded, and pressed to a division, shall be reduced to writing and recorded in full in the proceedings.

16. *Power of Chairman to rule out a proposal or amendment*—The Chairman of the meeting may, for reasons to be recorded in writing and entered in the minutes of the proceedings, rule that a proposal or amendment is illegal or out of order and may refuse to put it to the meeting.

The decision of the Chairman shall be final.

17. *Proposal by Chairman*—When a proposal or an amendment has been put from the chair it shall not be necessary for it to be seconded. If it has been declared by the Chairman to be duly carried, no further proposal for amendment shall be entertained.

18. *Right to speak*—The members who first rises to address the meeting shall be entitled to be heard first, and should more than one member rise simultaneously to address the meeting, the order of precedence shall be determined by the Chairman of the meeting.

19. *Point of order*—Any member shall be at liberty to call the attention of the Chairman of the meeting to a point of order, even when a member is speaking. On a point of order being raised the member addressing the meeting shall resume his seat until the question has been decided by the Chairman. After the decision of the Chairman the same point of order cannot be raised again. Except as provided by this regulation no member shall interrupt a speaker in possession of the meeting.

20. *Right of reply*—The mover of a proposal or amendment shall, in all cases have a right of reply, but otherwise no member shall speak more than once on the same proposal or amendment, unless in explanation of some part of his original speech.

21. *Motion for adjournment*—(1) A motion for an adjournment of the business of the Municipal Committee

for the purpose of discussing a definite matter of general public importance may be made with the consent of the Chairman of the meeting.

(2) The adjournment of the meeting should be moved in as soon as not exceeding five minutes in duration.

Disallowance and objection to motion on certain grounds—(3) No motion for an adjournment of the business of the Municipal Committee for the purpose of discussing a different matter of urgent public importance shall be admissible if it relates to a matter which is not primarily the concern of the Municipal Committee.

(4) No motion for the adjournment of the meeting shall be admissible which proposes an adjournment beyond the next ordinary meeting.

(5) When a motion for the adjournment of the meeting is made it shall be seconded without speech and put by the Chairman to the vote with an amendment.

22. *Adjournment*—The Chairman of the meeting may for sufficient reasons to be recorded in writing adjourn any meeting and if possible announce the date and time of the adjourned meeting.

23. *Business of adjourned meeting*—No business shall be transacted at an adjourned meeting save that which was left unfinished at the original meeting.

24. *Decision by vote*—All matters which may come before the meeting shall be decided by a majority of votes which may be ascertained by show of hands. In case of equality of votes, the Chairman of the meeting shall have a second or casting vote.

25. *Voting in person*—Voting by proxy is prohibited and no member shall vote on any proposal or amendment unless he be present in person at the time when it is put to the vote.

26. *Vote of no confidence*—(a) When a special meeting is to be convened for moving a vote of no confidence against a Vice-Chairman, a minimum of seven days' clear notice shall be given to each member along with a copy of the agenda.

(b) For a special meeting for moving a vote of no confidence against a Vice-Chairman, the quorum shall form of one-half of the total number of members plus one more member.

IV—Other matters

27. *Direction by Controlling authority to consider any matter*—Notwithstanding anything contained in these regulations the controlling authority may direct that any matter to be specified by him be considered by a Municipal Committee within a specified time and thereon the committee shall consider such matter within the period specified.

28. *Reconsideration of matter once disposed of*—Unless the controlling authority otherwise directs, a subject once finally disposed of may be reconsidered within six months of its disposal, provided that at least two-third of the total number of members may by signing a requisition at any time require it to be reconsidered.

29. *Committee of whole body*—For the purpose of taking into consideration any business involving the details, the meeting may resolve itself into a committee of the whole body. When such action has been taken, the regulation prohibiting any person from speaking more than once on the same question shall be deemed suspended until the meeting resumes.

30. *Common seal and its custody*—The common seal shall remain in the custody of the Chairman. It is provided that if a Secretary has been appointed by the Chairman may by written order delegate the custody of the seal to the Secretary.

31. *Inspection of any work*—The Municipal Committee may, from time to time delegate to one or more of its members the duty of inspecting any work which is being carried out under its order or any institution under its control and management.

32. *Reporting of decision to controlling authority*—All decisions taken by a Municipal Committee shall be reported to the controlling authority within three days of the date of such decisions being taken.

W—Constitution of Sub-Committees including co-option of members and conduct of business

33. *Sub-Committee*—The Municipal Committee may appoint any of the following or other Sub-Committees as may appear to be necessary in pursuance of section 24 of the Ordinance, namely:

- (1) Finance Sub-Committee.
- (2) Works Sub-Committee.
- (3) Water Supply and Epidemic Control Sub-Committee.

34. *Size of Sub-Committee*—A Sub-Committee shall not ordinarily consist of more than one-third of the total number of members of the Municipal Committee and no member shall at the same time be member of more than two such committees.

35. *Member's personal interest*—No member of any Sub-Committee shall participate in considering any matter relating to the committee in which he happens to have a personal interest.

36. *Term of member of Sub-Committee*—The members of a Sub-Committee shall hold office for one year only but shall be eligible for reappointment.

37. *Co-option*—The Municipal Committee, may associate with any sub-committee for such period as it may think fit, any person of either sex who is not a member of the committee but who may, in the opinion of the committee, possess special qualifications for serving on such sub-committee, such persons shall not have any right to vote at meetings of the Sub-Committee but shall be deemed to be members thereof for all purposes for such period:

Provided that the number of members so appointed on any Sub-Committee shall not exceed one-third of the total number of members of such sub-committee.

38. *Cessation of membership of Sub-Committee*—A member of a Sub-Committee who, without reasonable excuse, fails to attend three consecutive meetings of such Sub-Committee shall thereby cease to be a member of such Sub-Committee and the committee may fill the vacancy thus caused.

39. *Convener of Sub-Committee*—Every Sub-Committee shall appoint one of its members to be its convener:

Provided that no person shall at the same time be the convener of more than one sub-committee.

40. *Chairman in absence of the convener*—In the absence of the convener the members of the Sub-Committee shall choose one of its members to preside over its meeting.

41. *Functions of Sub-Committee*—The Municipal Committee may by specific resolution delegate to, or withdraw from a Sub-Committee any of its functions, and may also from time to time, by like resolution, refer to it for enquiry and report or for opinion, such subject relating to its functions, as the Committee may think fit.

42. *Obligation of Sub-Committee*—A Sub-Committee

exercise the powers delegated to it by the Committee, and shall be liable to obligations imposed by the Ordinance on the Municipal Committee in respect of such powers.

43. *Instructions to conform*—Every Sub-Committee shall conform to any instructions that may from time to time by the Municipal Committee.

44. *Resolution Book of Sub-Committee*—The resolutions passed by a Sub-Committee shall be recorded in a book to be kept for this purpose, and shall be signed by the convener of the Sub-Committee.

45. *Confirmation of resolution of Sub-Committee*—The proceedings of every Sub-Committee shall be subject to confirmation or modification by the Municipal Committee unless in a special case the Committee otherwise directs.

46. *Meetings of Sub-Committee*—A Sub-Committee may meet and adjourn, as it thinks proper.

47. *Quorum of Sub-Committee*—The quorum of a Sub-Committee shall be one-third of its total number, provided that not less than two shall constitute a quorum.

48. *Decision by majority votes*—Every subject or matter at a meeting of a Sub-Committee shall be determined by a majority of votes of the members present and voting on that occasion. In case of equality of votes, the Chairman of the meeting shall have a second or casting vote.

49. *Joint Committee*—A Joint Committee appointed under section 113 of the Ordinance shall be composed of equal number of members from each of the Municipal Committee or Committees, local council or councils or other local authority or authorities joining in appointing Joint Committee.

VI—Organisation of the Municipal Office into departments and branches.

50. *Organisation of the Municipal office*—The Municipal Committee shall in a meeting divide the organisation of the Municipal Office into any of the following or other departments as may appear to be necessary and shall define the duties of each department:

- (1) Assessment Department.
- (2) Collection Department.
- (3) Establishment Department.
- (4) Works Department.
- (5) Health and Sanitation Department.
- (6) Education Department.
- (7) Development Department.

The Municipal Committee may in a meeting divide all or any of such Departments into as many Branches as may appear to be necessary and define the duties of such branches.

The Final Estimate of Tobacco Crop of East Pakistan for the year 1959-60.

Note—Tobacco is grown more or less in all the districts of East Pakistan but it is extensively cultivated in the district of Rangpur. This crop is generally planted from October to December. The present estimate covers the period from October 1959 to the end of July 1960 and deals with revised estimate of acreage and production.]

Character of the Season—The weather condition was not favourable at the time of sowing due to heavy showers in October and November. As a result the transplantation begun a bit late this year. The subsequent weather up to the harvesting time also was not at all favourable for the growth and maturity of the crop due to constant drought throughout the Province.

Acreage—The total area under tobacco crop in East Pakistan is estimated at 110,100 acres this year as against 110,700 acres of last year.

Average Outturn—The average outturn of the crop for the Province as a whole is estimated at 48 per cent. of the normal this year as against 73 per cent. of the normal shown in the final estimate of last year.

Total yield—On the basis of 48 per cent. as the average Provincial outturn and 14 maunds as the normal rate of yield per acre, the total yield of the crop for the Province works out to 27,200 tons this year as against 41,600 tons of last year. The decrease in yield is due to unfavourable weather condition at sowing time and subsequent constant drought up to the harvesting time.
