No. LG/IV/2D-2/61/282—19th May 1961—The following draft of a further amendment to the Bengal Drugs Rules, 1946, as in force in East Pakistan, which the Provincial Government, after consultation with the Drugs Technical Advisory Board, proposes to make, in exercise of the powers conferred by section 33 of the Drugs Act, 1940 (XXIII of 1940), is published, as required by the said section, for the information of all persons likely to be affected thereby, and notice is hereby given that the draft will be taken into consideration after the expiry of a period of thirty days from its publication in the official Gazette. Any objections or suggestions which may be received from any person in respect of the said draft within the said period will be considered by the Provincial Government.

Draft Amendment

In the said rules, in schedule J, after paragraph 9, the following new paragraph 10 shall be added, namely:—

10. Medicines prepared in accordance with and intended solely for the treatment of patients under Homeopathic system of medicine.

All the provisions of Chapter IV of the Act and the rules thereunder, subject to the condition that a container containing such drugs shall bear a label "Homeopathic".

No. LG/IV/2D-2/61/283—19th May 1961—The following draft of certain further amendments to the Bengal Drugs Rules, 1946, as in force in East Pakistan, which the Provincial Government after consultation with the Drugs Technical Advisory Board, proposes to make in exercise of the powers conferred by section 33 of the Drugs Act, 1940 (XXIII of 1940), is published, as required by the said section, for the information of all persons likely to be affected thereby, and notice is hereby given that the draft will be taken into consideration after the expiry of a period of 30 days from its publication in the official Gazette. Any objections or suggestions which may be received from any person in respect of the said draft within the said period will be considered by the Provincial Government.

Draft Amendments

In the said Rules,—

- (1) after clause (c) of rule 3, in the first proviso, after the words "graduate in medicine or science" the words "or Pharmacy" shall be inserted;
- (2) in rule 8, after clause (c), the following new clause shall be added, namely—
- (d) is a graduate in medicine and holds a diploma in public health from an institution approved for this purpose by the appointing

- (3) in rule 18—
 (a) in sub-rule (2)—
 (i) after the words "rupees five" the words "which in no case shall be refundable" shall be added; and
 (ii) after the words "rupees ten" occurring at the end of the proviso, the words "which in no case shall be refundable" shall be added.
 (b) after sub-rule (2), the following sub-rule shall be added, namely—
 "(3) If the original licence issued under this rule is lost, defaced or damaged, a duplicate copy thereof may be issued on payment of a fee of rupees three, which shall in no case be refundable".
- (4) in rule 24, in clause (9), after the words and letter "Schedule G" the words "and preparations containing any such substance" shall be inserted.
- (5) in rule 28,—
 (a) after the figures "28" occurring at the beginning of that rule, the brackets and figure "(1)" shall be inserted;
 (b) after the words "rupees twenty", the words "which in no case shall be refundable" shall be added; and
 (c) the following new sub-rule shall be added at the end, namely—
 "(2) If the original licence issued under this rule is lost, defaced or damaged, a duplicate copy thereof may be issued on payment of a fee of rupees ten which shall in no case be refundable."
- (6) (a) in rule 30, in clause (2), for the words "two years" the words "six months" shall be substituted.
 (b) for clause (3) of rule 30, the following shall be substituted, namely—
 "(3) a person who holds a diploma in pharmacy from an institution approved by the licensing authority and whose practical experience, extending over not less than three years, in the manufacturing of drugs is, in the opinion of the licensing authority, adequate";
- (7) in rule 34—
 (a) after the figures "34" occurring at the beginning of that rule, the brackets and figure "(1)" shall be inserted;
 (b) after the words "one hundred" the words "neither of which shall be refundable" shall be added; and
 (c) the following new sub-rule shall be added at the end, namely—
 "(2) If the original licence issued under this rule is lost, defaced or damaged, a duplicate copy thereof may be issued on payment of a fee of rupees ten which shall in no case be refundable".
- (8) for rule 66, the following shall be substituted, namely:—
 "66. *Name of substance*—If any substance specified in schedule C is advertised or sold as a proprietary medicine or is contained in a medicine so advertised or sold, the proper name of the substance shall appear on the label in the manner prescribed in this Part.
- Explanation*—For the purposes of this rule the proper name means the proper name stated in Schedule F or if no such name is stated in Schedule F the name descriptive of the nature and origin of the substance.
- (9) in rule 68, for clause (b) of sub-rule (1), the following shall be substituted, namely:—
 "(b) the number of every licence under which the substance or any of its constituents manufactured or imported preceded in the case of imported drugs by the words "Import Licence No....." granted under Rule 23".
- (10) in rule 73, after clause (h), the following new clause shall be inserted, namely—
 "(i) preparation from cultures of pathogenic organisms in a form to be administered orally, which must be sterile".
- (11) in Schedule C, after entry 13, the following new entry shall be added, namely:—
 "14. Bacteriophages".
- (12) in Schedule E, after Part VIII, the following new Part shall be inserted, namely:—
 "Part VIII A—Provisions applicable to the production of Bacteriophages.

General

1. (a) This Part applies to the bacteriophage made from any micro-organism pathogenic to man or other animal.

(b) For the purpose of this Part a bacteriophage means a sterile preparation derived from a culture of the micro-organism from which the bacteriophage derives its name.

2. *Staff of Establishment*—Any establishment where bacteriophages are prepared must be under the complete direction and control of a competent expert in bacteriology, who must be assisted by staff adequate for carrying out the tests required during the preparation of the bacteriophages and in connection with the finished products.

3. *Proper Name*—The proper name of any bacteriophage shall be the word Bacteriophage followed by the name of the micro-organism from which it is prepared or other name approved by the licensing authority.

4. *Records*—(a) Cultures used in the preparation of Bacteriophage must, before being manipulated into a bacteriophage, be identified by the generally accepted tests applicable to the particular micro-organism.

(b) The permanent records which the licensee may be required to keep shall include a record of the origin, properties and characteristics of the cultures.

5. *Combined Bacteriophage*—(a) Bacteriophage may be issued either singly or combined in the same container.

(b) In the case of combination of a bacteriophage a name for the combined bacteriophage may be submitted by the licensee to the licensing authority which, if approved, may be used as the proper name of the bacteriophage.

6. *Container*—The container shall be sealed glass ampoule of non-alkaline resistance glass.

7. *Labelling*—The label of the bacteriophage;

(a) the proper name of the bacteriophage;

(b) the words "for oral administration only";

(c) the date of manufacture; and

(d) a caution to the effect that if the preparation is cloudy or shows deposit it should be discarded.

8. *Tests*—Bacteriophages shall be subject to the same tests for sterility as prescribed in these rules for bacterial vaccines".

Character of the season—The weather conditions and its effect on the crop were normal at the time of sowing. Subsequent continuous drought also adversely affected these crops in most of the districts. Harvesting, however, started normally.

Acreage—The total area under these crops is estimated as shown below—
