- (a) in the case of money orders booked by the National Bank of Pakistan, the Habib Bank and the United Bank in respect of remittances received from abroad for payees in Pakistan, five thousand rupees ; and

Bye-Laws for regulating the seizure and confiscation of the ownerless animals in Quetta Cantonment

The following bye-laws for regulating the seizure and confiscation of the ownerless animals in Quetta Cantonment framed by Cantonment Board, Quetta in exercise of the powers conferred by clause (6) of Sections 282 and 283 of the Cantonments Act, 1924 (II of 1924) are hereby published for general information, the same having been previously published and having been approved and confirmed by the Central Government as required by sub section (1) of Section 284 of the said Act namely :

Bye-laws for regulating the seizure and confiscation of the ownerless animals in Quetta Cantt.

1. In these bye-laws, the word "animal" means an animal of any description excepting dogs, provision for which is made in bye-laws framed under section 119 of the Cantonments Act, 1924, and includes a camel, buffalo, horse, mare, gelding, pony, colt, filly, mule, bull, bullock, cow, heifer, calf, ass, pig, ram, ewe, sheep, lamb, goat or kid.

2. Any animal found straying in public place in the Cantonment without being under proper care or control, shall be liable to seizure and to be sent at once to the nearest pound established under section 4 of the Cattle Trespass Act, 1871.

3. Any animal found straying on any private land or building within the Cantonment, without being under proper care or control may be seized by the owner, tenant, or keeper of such land or building and sent at once to the nearest pound established under section 4 of the Cattle Trespass Act, 1871.

4. Every animal sent to the pound under the provisions of bye-laws 2 and 3 shall be dealt with as if it had been impounded under the provisions of the Cattle Trespass Act, 1871, and the provisions of said Act shall apply thereto.

"ALL PAKISTAN" FINAL ESTIMATE OF "OTHER KHARIF PULSES" (VIZ., MASH-KALAI, GARI-KALAI, MUNG, COWPEAS, LONG BARBATI ETC.), RELEASED BY THE DEPARTMENT OF MARKETING INTELLIGENCE AND AGRICULTURAL STATISTICS.

Ino. MI/AS-MC(7)/64.—Area.—According to the final estimate for the year 1963-64, the total area under other Kharif pulses (viz., mash-kalai, gari-kalai, mung, cowpeas and long barbat) of East Pakistan grown during Kharif season) has been estimated at 143,300 acres against 141,900 acres estimated last year (1962-63). The area has, thus, registered an insignificant increase of 0.9 per cent over the final estimate of the last year.

In East Pakistan, the area decreased by 7.6 per cent in spite of an increase of 46.2 and 62.5 per cent observed in Rajshahi and Khulna divisions respectively.

In West Pakistan, the area increased by 2.1 per cent. This increase in area was shared by Peshawar, Rawalpindi and Sargodha divisions. The increase in

these divisions is reported to be due to some localised rains and normal canal water supply during the sowing period coupled with scarcity of rains.

Production.—The production of "other Kharif pulses" for the year 1963-64 is estimated at 26,300 tons against 24,800 tons during the preceding year. It has thus, registered an increase of 6.0 per cent.

In East Pakistan, the production decreased by 8.5 per cent. This decrease is attributed to damage caused by cyclone which swept over certain districts combined with decrease in area.

West Pakistan showed an increased production to the extent of 9.5 per cent. The increase was shared by Peshawar, Rawalpindi and Sargodha divisions, which may be attributed to corresponding increased acreage, and normal rains and canal water supply. Successful control of pests and diseases also contributed towards increased production. In other divisions, the production declined due to scarcity of rains.

A statement showing the divisionwise area and production is given on next page.
