Licensing procedure for export of cotton piecegoods, cotton yarn and cotton made-up goods to the United States of America under bilateral agreement.

No. 1(34)66-C.II.—Export of cotton textiles from Pakistan to the United States of America is regulated by the bilateral agreement signed between the two countries on 26th February 1965, and export licences are issued in accordance with the procedure laid down in this Ministry's Public Notice No. 1(9) 65-C.II, dated 18th March 1965.

In consultation with the representatives of the Government of United States, it has now been decided to modify the agreement in its operation during the current year (1966-67) to the following effect:

- (i) Export of all categories of cotton textiles, except handloom products, will be subject to an aggregate ceiling of 55 million sq. yds.
- (ii) Within this overall limit, individual ceilings will be available for some specified categories or fabrics and made-up goods, in addition to a ceiling for non-specified categories of fabrics and another ceiling on non-specified categories of made-up goods.

Licences for export of cotton textiles to the United States will henceforth be issued in accordance with the following procedure which will supersede the licensing procedure announced in the Public Notice mentioned above:—

- (1) All exports of cotton piecegoods, cotton yarn and cotton made-up goods to the U.S.A.

except handloom products will be subject to export licences with immediate effect.

- (2) Export licences will be issued by the Assistant Controller of Imports and Export, Export Wing, Custom House, Karachi, and the Controllers of Imports and Export, Lahore, Dacca and Chittagong to the exporters who have been allotted quotas in their behalf by the Export Promotion Bureau, Karachi, or by an authority appointed by the Bureau in this behalf. Licences will be issued for the specified categories of cotton textiles in which quotas are allotted.
- (3) The Export Promotion Bureau may, if necessary, direct the exporters to deposit a cash security or bank guarantee at a rate not exceeding 25 paise per square yard for utilisation of the quota allotted to them during the half year for which it is meant.
- (4) The licensing authorities mentioned in paragraph (2) above will issue licences to quota holders up to the quotas fixed from time to time on production of documentary evidence of contracts.
- (5) Licences to be issued for export shall be valid for the half year for which quotas are allotted. These export licences will not be normally renewed.
