In exercise of the powers conferred by Article 178 of the Constitution, the President is pleased to make the following rules for the appointment of members of the Appellate Tribunal under section 5A of the Income-tax Act, 1922 (XI of 1922), namely:—

- (1) These rules may be called the Income-tax Appellate Tribunal (Appointment of Members) Rules, 1968.
- They shall come into force at once.
- In these rules, unless there is anything repugnant in the subject or context,—
 - “Commission” means the Central Public Service Commission, and
 - “member” means a member of the Appellate Tribunal appointed under section 5A of the Income-tax Act, 1922 (XI of 1922).

3. Appointment of a member shall be made upon the recommendation of the Commission from amongst persons who possess the qualifications required by sub-section (3) of section 5A of the Income-tax Act, 1922 (XI of 1922), or have such qualifications and experience as are mentioned in the proviso thereto in relation to an accountant, that is to say.—

- (a) in the case of judicial member, a person who has exercised the powers of a District Judge or who possesses such qualifications as are normally required for appointment to the post of District Judge; and
- (b) in the case of accountant member, a person who has, for a period of not less than six years, practised professionally as a Registered Accountant enrolled on the Register of Accountants maintained by the Central Government under the Auditors' Certificates Rules, 1950, or in respect of whom the Central Government is satisfied that he has qualifications and has had adequate experience of a character which render him suitable for appointment as such member.

4. (1) The recommendation of the Commission for appointment as a member shall be made from amongst the persons who, upon invitation of applications for such appointment, have applied to the Commission in accordance with these rules.

(2) An application under sub-rule (1) shall be made by such date, in such form and manner and accompanied by such fee as the Commission may prescribe.

(3) Every application under sub-rule (1) shall be accompanied by,—

- (a) certificates of character and antecedent as to the suitability of the applicant for appointment as a member,
- (b) in the case of an applicant who was, at any time before his application, in Government service, the certificates or order in original, together with a copy, of his discharge or relief, and
- (c) such other documents as the Commission may require.

5. (1) Subject to the provisions of sub-rule (2), any person who possesses the qualifications mentioned in rule 3 shall be eligible to apply if—

- (a) he is a citizen of Pakistan or is a person deriving his nationality from the State of Jammu and Kashmir or a person whose temporary employment has been authorised by the President under clause (1) of Article 179 of the Constitution,
- (b) he is not less than forty years of age,
- (c) he has not married a foreign national other than an Indian national married after obtaining the permission of the Central Government, and

(d) he has, in the case of a person who is already in Government service, been permitted by the competent authority to apply.

(2) The application of a person who, after submission of his application, joins a Government service shall not be considered unless the consent in writing of the competent authority to his being considered for appointment as a member is submitted to the Commission.

6. (1) Subject to the provisions of sub-rule (2), appointment of members shall be so made that, as far as may be, the total number of appointments, reckoned up to the latest, conform to the following distribution, namely :—

(2) Appointment of members from a Province or any area thereof in accordance with the distribution under sub-rule (1) shall be so made that six per cent. of the total number of such appointments, reckoned up to the latest, are from the members of the Scheduled Castes.

7. No person shall be appointed as a member unless he is found, upon such medical examination as the Central Government may specify, to be in good mental and physical health and otherwise free from any such physical defect as is likely to interfere with the discharge of his duties.

8. (1) Upon his appointment as a member, a person shall, in the first instance, be on probation for a period of one year which the Central Government may extend for such further period not exceeding one year as it may think fit.

(2) The Central Government may, if it is of the opinion that the work or conduct of a person appointed on probation is not satisfactory and that he is not likely to be efficient, discharge or otherwise relieve him from the office of a member at any time before the completion of the period of his probation.

(3) The Central Government may confirm a person as a member after satisfactory conclusion of his period of probation.

(4) A person who is not discharged or relieved under sub-section (2) or confirmed under sub-rule (3) shall, upon the completion of his period of probation be deemed to have been appointed temporarily as a member, whose services are liable to be terminated with one month's notice on either side.

'ALL PAKISTAN' THIRD ESTIMATE OF RICE CROP FOR THE YEAR 1967-68 RELEASED BY THE DEPARTMENT OF MARKETING INTELLIGENCE AND AGRICULTURAL STATISTICS.

No. MIAS-E(8)68.—Area.—According to the third estimate for the year 1967-68 the area under rice crop has been placed at 27,839,000 acres as against 25,587,000 acres and 25,897,000 acres reported in the corresponding and final estimates of last year i.e. 1966-67. It shows an increase of 8.8 and 7.5 per cent. respectively over the two estimates of last year.

In East Pakistan, the area (including the area under boro) has increased to 24,422,000 acres from 22,205,000 acres of the corresponding estimate of last year registering an increase of 10.0 per cent which has been shared by all the divisions. The area under aus crop increased by 18 per cent, that under aman by 4.4 per cent and under boro crop by 28.6 per cent primarily due to extensive "Grow More Food" campaign launched by the Government thereby ensuring supply of better seeds, increased availability of irrigation water particularly through low lift pumps and greater reclamation of waste lands and favourable weather also added to this increase. There was keen enthusiasm among farmers to grow high yielding IRRI variety of rice particularly in boro and aus season.

In West Pakistan, the area has increased from 3,382,000 acres of the corresponding estimate of last year to 3,417,000 acres this year, showing a nominal increase of 1.0 per cent which is mainly due to increase in the acreage in D. I. Khan, Rawalpindi, Lahore, Sargodha divisions. The availability of high

yielding paddy seed of IRRI variety, timely rains at the time of transplantation and adequate supply of canal water favoured the increase while there was some decrease in Hyderabad and Khairpur divisions due to unfavourable weather, fear of stemborer attack and breach in Pat feeder canal, in other divisions it was due to diversion of area to other competitive crops.

Production.—According to the third estimate the production of rice for the year 1967-68 (excluding boro crop) has been placed at 11,347,000 tons as against 9,916,000 tons and 9,936,000 tons of the corresponding and final estimates of last year. This records an increase of 14.4 and 14.2 per cent respectively.

In East Pakistan the production of rice (excluding boro) has increased from 8,593,000 tons of the corresponding estimate of the previous year to 9,881,000 tons this year thereby showing an increase of 15.0 per cent. The production of autumn crop has increased by 14.8 per cent and that of winter by 15.1 per cent due to corresponding increase in acreage and greater application of various inputs.

In West Pakistan the production stands at 1,466,000 tons as against 1,323,000 tons of the corresponding estimate of last year and shows an increase of 10.8 per cent. This is attributed to regular water supply at the time of transplantation coupled with increased application of fertilizer, plant protection measures introduction of high yielding IRRI paddy seed and favourable weather.

"All Pakistan" first estimate of gram crop for the year 1967-68 released by the Department of Marketing Intelligence and Agricultural Statistics.

No. MI|AS-E(12)|68.—Area.—According to the first estimate for 1967-68 the area under gram crop has been placed at 3,063,000 acres as against 2,962,000 acres and 2,724,000 acres reported in the corresponding and final estimates of the preceding year and shows an increase of 3.4 and 12.4 per cent respectively.

In East Pakistan the area has been estimated at 152,000 acres as against 136,000 acres of the corresponding estimates of the previous year and shows an increase of 11.8 per cent. This rise shared by all

the divisions, is due to lucrative market prices and favourable weather conditions.

In West Pakistan the area has been recorded at 2,911,000 acres as against 2,826,000 acres of the corresponding estimates of last year. This shows an increase of 3.0 per cent. The increase, shared by all the divisions except Peshawar, Rawalpindi, Khairpur and Hyderabad is due to timely and sufficient rains at the time of sowing. The decline in acreage in the above mentioned divisions is due to diversion of area under wheat crop because of "Grow More Wheat" campaign launched by the Government.
