CHARTERED ACCOUNTANTS BYE-LAWS, 1961.

The following draft of certain amendments to the Chartered Accountants Bye-laws, 1961, which it is proposed to make, with the approval of the Central Government, in exercise of the powers conferred by

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sub-section (1) of section 27 of the Chartered Accountants Ordinance, 1961 (X of 1961), is published, as required by sub-section (3) of that section, for the information of all persons likely to be affected thereby, and notice is hereby given that the draft will be taken into consideration fifteen days after its publication in the official Gazette.

Any objection or suggestion which may be received with respect to the said draft within the period specified will be considered by the Council of the Institute of Chartered Accountants of Pakistan.

Draft Amendments

In the aforesaid Bye-laws,—

(1) in bye-law 67, in paragraph (ii), for the words "Intermediate Examination of a Board of Education", the words "Degree Examination of a University" shall be substituted;

(2) in bye-law 72, in clause (2), for the first proviso, the following shall be substituted, namely:—

"Provided that in the case of death, retirement, resignation or removal of a principal who is a partner of a firm, the articles of any clerk of such principal shall be deemed to be the articles of the successor of such principal or any other partner of the firm, according as the firm may decide, whether or not such successor or partner is entitled to train articulated clerks."; and

(3) in bye-law 77, in paragraph (b), for the words "Intermediate Examination of a Board of Education", the words "Degree Examination of a University" shall be substituted.

- (v) The repayment at the rate specified shall be allowed provided that the goods exported are manufactured with the same constituents on which the rate of repayment is notified and the manufacturer-cum-exporter shall immediately intimate to the Central Board of Revenue and the Directorate of Inspection and Training, Customs and Central Excise, Karachi,—
 - (a) any change in the prices of the imported raw materials,
 - (b) any changes in the composition of the manufactured goods to be exported; and

“ALL PAKISTAN” FINAL ESTIMATE OF LINSEED CROP FOR THE YEAR 1969-70 RELEASED BY THE MINISTRY OF AGRICULTURE AND WORKS

No. PU-OS(1)/70.—Area.—According to final estimate, the area under linseed crop for the year 1969-70 has been estimated at 50,086 acres as against 52,184 acres reported for 1968-69 and shows a decrease of 4.0 per cent.

In East Pakistan, the area under the crop is finally estimated at 35,755 acres as against 36,155 acres. It thus, shows a nominal decrease of 1.1 per cent. This decrease, shared by Chittagong and Khulna Divisions of the Province, has been ascribed to increased cultivation of other more profitable competing crops.

In West Pakistan, the area under linseed crop has been finally estimated at 14,331 acres as against 16,029 acres of the preceding year and shows a decrease of

10.6 per cent. This was mainly due to decrease in the major producing province of the Punjab.

In the Punjab, the area decreased to 13,630 acres from 15,808 acres (Revised) of 1968-69. It, thus, shows a decrease of 13.8 percent, which was due to the diversion of area to wheat and other competing crops.

In N.W.F.P., Sind and Baluchistan linseed is grown on a nominal scale.

In N.W.F.P., the area is reported at 542 acres for 1969-70 as against 208 acres of the previous year. In Sind, the area has been estimated at 159 acres as against 7 acres reported in the corresponding estimate of the preceding year. In Baluchistan, linseed is not grown.

Production.—The production of linseed crop for the year 1969-70 has been estimated at 10,638 tons as against 10,447 tons estimated for the corresponding estimate of the preceding year (i.e. 1968-69) and shows an increase of 1.8 per cent.

In East Pakistan, the production increased from 7,060 tons of 1968-69 to 7,359 tons of 1969-70 showing, thereby, an increase of 4.2 per cent. This was due to favourable weather.

In West Pakistan, the production of linseed during 1969-70 has been estimated at 3,279 tons as compared to 3,387 tons of 1968-69 and shows a decrease of 3.2 per cent.

In the Punjab, the production is estimated at 3,139 tons of 1969-70 as against 3,345 tons of 1968-69. It

thus shows a decrease of 6.2 per cent. In N.W.F.P. the production is estimated at 102 tons as against 38 tons of the preceding year and in Sind, the production is estimated at 38 tons as against 2 tons of 1968-69.
