**The Estimate of Mandarine crop of Bangladesh for 1971-72.**

[Note—In Bangladesh Mandarine crop is grown only in the districts of Sylhet and Chittagong Hill Tracts.]

Weather condition—The weather was fair for the crop in both the districts of Chittagong Hill Tracts and Sylhet.

Area—The total area under Mandarine trees in 1971-72 has been estimated at 2,078 acres as against 1,598 acres of 1970-71. The increase in area is due to new plantation for increased demand and favourable weather at plantation time.

Yield rate—The average yield per acre of the crop for 1971-72 has been estimated at 46.76 mds. as against 65.92 mds. of the previous year. The decrease in per acre yield is due to new plantation which have not yet reached the fruit-bearing age and lack of proper care during the last disturbance.

Production—The total production of the crop for 1971-72 stands at 3,555 tons as against 3,870 tons of last year. The decrease in production is due to decrease in yield rate.
